# Meet the Twisters



In October 2006
popular west coast
jump-blues outfit
The Twisters
signed with
NorthernBlues
and put out After The

Storm They were previously nominated for a JUNO Award in 2003 and have also been nominated for multiple Maple Blues Awards. They also won Canadian Independent Music Award for "Best Blues Album of the Year" for their second release "Long Hard Road"

Paying dues to the blues tradition, and The Twisters have paid more than most including a devastating automobile accident that took the life of their bass player, James Taylor, and injured the rest of the band in October 2005. They battened their hatches and rallied back with the acquisition of new upright bass player, Keith Picot, and recorded a brand new CD of original tunes. "Their new CD really turned my head - this should put The Twisters on the map of major blues players," said Fred Litwin, President of NorthernBlues Music.

Each of the members has brought his musical talents and influences to the table, resulting in a potpourri of "Blues Cuisine" guaranteed to satisfy the most discerning blues palette. From deep in the Mississippi Delta to early Chicago shuffles, from infectious Texas grinders to West Coast jump and funky swamp-soaked Louisiana rhythms, The Twisters serve up the goods. Top it all off with strong original compositions and a live show renowned for rockin' the house and there's only one thing left... do yourself a favour and see what the storm's all about when The Twisters blow through your town.

#### David "Hurricane" Hoerl,



Harmonica, Vocals

Born and raised in San Francisco, David was originally tutored by Rick Estrin and David Burgin in the art of Blues Harmonica. He has since played with some

of the best blues musicians in the U.S. and Canada, including: Mike Bloomfield, Albert Collins, Percy Mayfield, Big Mama Thornton, Little Joe Blue, Freddie Roulette, Big Joe Duskin, Pee Wee Crayton, Steve Freund,

Carl Weathersby, Phil Guy, Sonny Rhodes and Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne. In 1982 David came to Canada with Kenny Wayne, and became a landed immigrant in 1986. In Canada he has recorded with Powder Blues, Valdy, Gary Fjellgaard, and played on numerous jingles and commercials. He plays on almost all of Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne's recordings.

As the founding member and sole remaining original Twister, he has recorded 4 CD's, the latest-"After The Storm" on the Northern Blues label, released in 2006. He has received numerous accolades and awards for songwriting, vocals and harmonica playing, including being nominated in 1997, 1998, 2003, & 2005 for "Harmonica Player of the Year" by the Toronto Blues Society's "Maple Blues Awards". According to West Coast Blues Review (1995) and Real Blues Magazine (1996-2006) David Hoerl is: "Canada's Top Harp Blower"

#### **Brandon Isaak**

- Guitar, Vocals

This young red haired guitar player has monster tone and technique. He moved from his home town of Whitehorse, Yukon to Vancouver, BC in 1999, where he



joined the Twisters. He has shared the stage with many great blues artists, including Taj Mahal, Lil' Ed and the Blues Imperials, Robben Ford, Canned Heat, Jeff Healey, Zora Young, Big Dave McLean, and Rusty Zinn, just to name a few. Most recently, Brandon returned from a 2 month European tour, where he played along side Joe Louis Walker, Willie Hayes and Ken Faltonson on numerous festivals and TV shows.

Brandon played guitar on the 2006 Juno award-winning album "Let It Loose" with Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne, and appears on 11 albums with many different artists. When he plays, he travels to a different time and space. You can hear it as well as see it.



Matt Pease -Drums

Matt Pease has been working professionally as a drummer for over 20 years, and credits his hard swinging style to his early

influences Buddy Rich and Gene Krupa. Matt grew up in a musical family with a large record collection on Vancouver Island. He moved to Vancouver in 1997, after which he toured with the Michael Kaeshammer Trio in the DuMaurier Jazz Festival. Shortly thereafter he hooked up with Juno Award winner Lee Aaron for three years. Matt has also played with Juno Award winners Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne and Hugh Fraser. He's iammed with Angelo Moore (Fishbone) and members of the Brand New Heavies, and has played with artists such as Daniel Lapp, Ross Taggert, and Marc Atkinson (The Bills). He has shared a stage with Edgar Winter, the Wailers, Green Day and the Cherry Poppin' Daddies. Matt studied with the great Canadian drummers Claude Ranger and Don Leppard. He joined the Twisters in early 2005.

#### Keith Picot -Bass

Unforgettable is what a performance by stand-up bassist Keith Picot is. Better bass players one will encounter, but a bass player who



gives more of himself and is such a joy to watch is decidedly much harder to find. Whether singing and leading his own band, or supporting the talent of such bands as: The Twisters, Cousin Harley, Joe Dollar and Juno Award winner Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne, he always gives 110 percent. With a hard hitting slap style all his own he can drive a beat like the devil, then equally and effortlessly draw out the sweet tones of a saint. You are guaranteed pleasure when watching Keith Picot do what he loves to do.

two critically acclaimed live albums. **Duke Robillard**, a favourite of Toronto blues audiences, has earned his second Grammy nomination — this for his 16th Stony Plain album, "Stomp! The Blues Tonight." The nomination is in the Best Traditional Blues album category. Signed to a world-wide recording deal with the Edmonton, Alberta-based Canadian label, Robillard was previously nominated in 2007 for his Stony Plain release "Guitar Groove-a-Rama."

In addition to a long series of varied releases, Robillard has also produced (and played on) CDs for the label by more than a dozen artists, including Joe Louis Walker, Billy Boy Arnold, Jimmy Witherspoon, Herb Ellis, Jay McShann, Rosco Gordon and many others. In addition to his busy life in the studio — he's based in Rhode Island — Robillard is a road warrior who plays more than 200 dates each year in the U.S., Canada and Europe.

Stony Plain's president, Holger Petersen, praised Robillard for his contribution to the label's success. "Ever since we met (at the Winnipeg Folk Festival) in 1993, he has produced a constant stream of high quality recordings, each different from the one preceding it. "He exemplifies everything that's fine about the blues idiom; he is deeply committed to the music, and his approach to the blues combines passion, technique and the non-stop ability to swing."

from 1940-1992 by this legendary blues vocalist/pianist.

Born 1909 in New Orleans, Dupree apprenticed under barrelhouse ace Willie "Drive 'Em Down" Hall. Dupree would become an itinerant troubadour: his Indianapolis days had him featured along with Scrapper Blackwell and Leroy Carr.

In 1940 he relocated to Chicago where his recording hyperactivity commenced, often accompanied by Big Bill Broonzy, Tampa Red, and especially Brownie McGhee. Concurrent contracts on different labels never fazed him. He merely adopted an array of aliases, like Brother Blues, Duke Bayou, Lightnin' Jr, or Meat Head Johnson.

The dapper Dupree was also a titleholder in the Boogie Woogie division, delighting audiences with shakers like "Shim Sham Shimmy", "Shake Baby Shake", and "Jack's Boogie Woogie". When expounding upon mature themes he used his natural authoritative voice, as on "Can't Kick The Habit" or "Give Me Flowers While I'm Living". On jaunty items like "Tongue-Tied Blues", slurred vocals were utilized for humorous effect.

His most enduring number "Junker's Blues" is a variation on a blues standard. Fats Domino later sanitized it on his 1949 debut "The Fat Man". Champion Jack's 1957 album "Blues From The Gutter" chronicled life's sordid side (jail, drinking, and drugs) and it's regarded as a masterpiece.

By 1959, racial mistreatment induced Dupree's voluntary exile to Europe where he would enchant audiences for decades. 1992 marked his last American tour, including a returning hero's welcome in New Orleans. Two final releases "Forever And Ever" and "One Last Time" topped off Champion Jack Dupree's illustrious career with exclamation points.





Jack De Keyzer Sessions Blue Star

The Corktown

Jack has been one of our hardest-working bluesmen, touring constantly. The one thing that sustains this level of employment is a show that people want to see. This new CD documents that show. An earlier live CD, Silver Blues, recorded at Hugh's Room a couple of years ago, was a speciallyarranged career retrospective, this one is the regular touring show and it cooks. The auspicious evening was at the Corktown Tavern in Hamilton last May 1st with Dave McMorrow, keyboards, Alan Duffy, bass and Danny Lockwood, drums. The songs, as many of you will know first hand, are excellent. Your favourites: "Blues Thing", "Soul Lover", "King Of The Blues" and my favourite, "Engine Trouble" are what bring fans to the shows. He also adds a few that keep the dance floor full, like "Signed Sealed Delivered" and "Hold On I'm Coming". Robert Johnson's "When You Got A Good Friend", in a new arrangement by Jack, is also a highlight. You may have purchased the studio CDs that feature these songs but with this CD you can have Jack's show in your music room or your car whenever you

Bill King Blues Piano Collection, Vol. 17 Arts

Bill King's many activities in our music scene include releases on his own record labels going back to the early 1990's. This new one collects the blues highlights. Although primarily considered a jazz



musician, his early career included stints in various blues and R&B bands culminating with joining The Full Tilt Boogie Band behind Janis Joplin. He has stayed close to the blues over the years - anyone who has heard his Saturday Night Fish Fry & Rocket 88 bands can testify to that. Songs from those units dominate this collection but are joined by others from a prolific career, beginning with a fine version of "Fine & Mellow" featuring Liberty Silver. As a jazz player, his definition of blues is not confined by a twelve bar structure and what you'll find here straddles the often fuzzy line between R&B and jazz, but with the blues at its centre. I think this disc also goes beyond Bill's role as a blues pianist to highlight his role as a bandleader. In this respect he can be compared to Johnny Otis, perhaps, who was also always looking for new talent. His greatest find, as far as this column is concerned, is Shakura S'Aida, who is featured here on the marvelous "Maybelle's Blues", taken from Rhythm & Soul. Other highlights are "Memphis Ivory Jag", "Key To The Highway", "Room 13 Blues" and "I Have Had My Fun", from an earlier recording. Bill acknowledges the work of Neil Chapman on guitar on most of these songs and he is often more prominent than Bill. The combination is one of the highlights of these later albums, and this one. Bill doesn't always put his own name on his albums but he sure can play blues piano. This release is a great way of perhaps drawing attention to someone who is usually in the background.

Various Artists Things About Comin' My Way Black Hen/Koch


Black Hen's Steve Dawson has undertaken an ambitious and hugely successful project that has as its sub-title "A Tribute To The Music Of The Mississippi Sheiks". This entertaining string band had a varying lineup but usually included Sam Chatmon, Walter Vinson, fiddler Lonnie Chatmon & third brother Bo. They recorded in the early thirties and their 78's have remained influential, especially among performers, although only "Sitting On Top Of The World" can be called a blues standard. Dawson's idea was to ask a variety of performers to participate by choosing & arranging the song of their choice. Seventeen



are here and the stellar lineup is an indication of how well the proposal was received. Bruce Cockburn, The North Mississippi Allstars, John Hammond, Madeleine Peyroux, Kelly Joe Phelps, Bill Frisell, The Sojourners, Jim Byrnes and more are here and all with well thought-out and committed performances. The Sheiks were not a blues band – they performed whatever songs their audiences asked for, white or black. The arrangements here stretch those loose boundaries even more, making for a uniquely varied listening experience. Having said that, the CD begins with three straightforward blues, by the Allstars, a welcome one from Ndidi Onukwulu and of course John Hammond. Cockburn's fine version of "Honey Babe Let The Deal Go Down" has a trombone joining the band. Oh Susanna uses a string quartet arranged by Van Dyke Parks. Guitarist Del Rey studied with Sam Chatmon and her version of "We Both Are Feeling Good Right Now" uses two clarinets. The Sojourners chose "He Calls That Religion" and those gospel harmonies add a little twist to the tale of a philandering preacher. It is little wonder that this CD has been nominated for Acoustic Album of the Year at the Blues Music Awards in Memphis.

Joe Louis Walker Between A Rock and The Blues Stony Plain/Warner

Sometimes there are too many albums released at the same time for my column and lo and behold, before I can get to this one, it lands five Blues Music Awards nominations. This is album #20 for Mr. Walker and his second on Stony Plain. Once



again, **Duke Robillard** is at the helm with many of his players and this team is hard to beat. Walker's originals are all highlights: the opening "I'm Tide" was released as a

free download, making it the equivalent of a single, I guess and it's a good choice, full of energy, in spite if its title. It's nominated for Song of the Year. "Black Widow Spider" is more in a soul vein and wonderfully done. "If There's A Heaven" is one of two songs done without Duke. Kevin Eubanks of Jav **Leno**'s band collaborates on one of the songs in the rock end of the title and it's one of the best songs here. "Way Too Expensive" goes back to a more traditional Texas blues sound. this one written by Murali Corvell, Larry's son. "I've Been Down" is another new one with some different formulations of a wellused theme, set to a good rocking tune. This song and, indeed, the whole CD has some of the finest guitar work of Walker's career. This is the other one without Duke. Duke contributes "Tell Me Why" and gets to solo while Walker plays slide. With a slow blues from **Ray Charles** and a rocker from **Roy Gaines**, we get to the closing acoustic "Send You Back", with **Sugar Ray Norcia** on harp. This CD is nominated for Album of the Year and Contemporary Blues Album. With strong material and performances, this is a strong contender on May 6th in Memphis. Walker himself is nominated in the Best Contemporary Male Artist and as Guitarist of the Year.
