

RAOUL BHANEJA SET TO HOST THE MAPLE BLUES AWARDS

The Maple Blues Awards will be held on Blue Monday, January 21. Blue Monday, typically thought to be the most



depressing day of the year will be anything but, as Raoul Bhaneja, a Toronto actor and musician most noted for his work performing Shakespeare's Hamlet solo and his blues band Raoul and the Big Time, is set to host the 16th annual Maple Blues Awards on January 21, 2013 at Koerner Hall in Toronto.

A yet to be announced cast of some of the best National blues musicians will be performing at the ceremony, all backed by The Maple Blues Band featuring Gary Kendall, Michael Fonfara, Teddy Leonard, Al Lerman, Tom Bona, Chris Whiteley, Pat Carey and Chris Murphy. Following the ceremony will be the popular after-party, featuring live music. Tickets for the Maple Blues Awards are on sale now for \$35 - \$65 and can be purchased at The Weston Family Box Office, located in The Royal Conservatory building at 273 Bloor Street West, Toronto or online at https://tickets.rcmusic. ca/public.

After many years of performing the duties of co-chairs of the Maple Blues Awards nominating panel, both Brent Staeben and John Valenteyn have stepped down to focus on their many other commitments in the blues community. The Toronto Blues Society is happy to introduce a new steering committee for the nominating panel that includes Deborah Cartmer, Program Director at CFBU FM radio in St. Catharines, Yves Trottier, Program Director at Dawg FM and Paul Norton, Programmer at CFRO FM and CITR FM radio in Vancouver.

The Maple Blues Awards is Canada's national blues awards program. Its goal is to promote blues music across Canada, and to recognize outstanding achievement in the field. Each year, the Maple Blues Awards recognizes a leader in the blues community with the Blues With A Feeling Award (Lifetime Achievement Award).

The Maple Blues Awards will be wrapping up the biennial Blues Summit, a weekend of panels, discussions and workshops for blues artists, promoters, agents and festivals. On Sunday, January 20 the keynote speaker for Blues Summit Six is Holger Petersen, who in addition to being the president of Stony Plain Records, is also the host of CBC Radio's popular program, Saturday Night Blues, host of CKUA's Natch'l Blues and programmer of the Galaxie Blues channel.

Sacha Williamson: The Soul-filled Visionary

In today's music world of Justin Bieber, Chris Brown, Jay-Z, et al, many musicians are under pressure to produce and sell

> "crappy music as long as millions can be made off CD sales." Thus, the message driven home for many young musicians is to go into genres such as Hip-Hop, Reggae or Rock 'n' roll if they would like successful, glamorous music careers. In their pursuit of fame, many of these

musicians end up losing themselves.

For this reason, Toronto-born singer and songwriter, Sacha Williamson, worried about "not fitting in the clear cookie cutter box" of the music world.

"I wasn't a pop girl; neither did I want go down that road music-wise", she says. "I like music that makes me cry".

However, Sacha got her epiphany when people would come up to her telling about their sense of "renewal and feelings of cleansing" after her performances. Through her use of warm lush harmonies, strong melodic hooks, and lyrical analogies, she invites audiences to look into a higher consciousness, where a message of hope and infinite possibilities prevails. Her sincerity, spiritual essence and passion infuse each song and performance, leaving audiences genuinely moved and inspired. From jazz, soul, to electronic music and Latin, her diverse genres and repertoire is authentically all her own.

"I'm not just a singer," she says, "My purpose is to open people up, bring them healing and some sort of comfort."

She draws inspiration from musicians like Sunny Boys, Nina Simone, Billy Holiday, and John Lucian who sang about their true life experiences and their social conditions.

"I love these people who can be truthful and vulnerable," she says, "It's about leaving yourself naked through your voice. "

Sacha has garnered attention and appreciation for her "soul-filled" music working with world renowned house music producer Nick Holder, New York producer Mr. V, broken beat pioneer Ig Culture, and Swedish sensation Opolopo. She has recorded for Virgin Canada, V2 (Virgin U.K.), Shelter Records New York and Toronto's Do Right Music! to name a few.

An Alumnus of York University's music program in Toronto, Sacha is a teacher of Jazz Vocal at the same school. She is the founder of Soul Writing Academy, a creative healing arts school. Its purpose is to inspire, encourage and cultivate the artist within people. She holds small groups workshops with artists to help them rediscover themselves and tackle roadblocks that may be preventing them from reaching their "true potential." These workshops range from various themes that include guided meditation, creative vocal play and improvisation.

She says, "I believe we are all artists and nurturing that within ourselves gives us the freedom to grow in every aspect of our lives."

She is a spiritual person who strongly believes we are interconnected as humans. She meditates every day, and it was during one of these routines that she received the vision of starting the Soul Writing Academy formulated the curriculum for the courses. She is working on attaining her Reiki Master, which she believes will allow her to help others. "I live and breathe spirit "she says, "I hope we can all see a light within each other."

Sacha is the youngest of three children but has had to grow up fast. Her mother, Veronica, whom she calls her "best friend, love and heart", was diagnosed with Alzheimer nine years ago. She would suffer a stroke that led many doctors to believe that she would not survive. Miraculously, her mother is still alive, though in hospital. Sacha rotates visiting her, with her father who suffers from Parkinson's diseases.

"My mother is a transformer of love," she says. "She is the cutest, sweetest person, I just love her."

In fact Sacha wrote a song "Mood of Veronica" dedicated to her mother in which the child in her cries and yearns to have her best friend back. The song was about how much she misses the person her mother used to be.

"She used to encourage me all the time, 'Sacha you have to do this!!!' she remembers,"I am who I am today because of her compassion."

Despite all the difficulties surrounding her, this songstress is not slowing down! Sacha is determined to keep going. She and her band are working on their next album which she promises will be a live recording.

On Saturday, November 24th, Sacha takes the stage at the Women's Blues Revue concert at Massey Hall.

"I only sing from the heart," she says. "I want people to leave the show feeling that they saw their own greatness."



Jordan John's Signs:Multi-Instrumentalist Jordan John has signed a historic five album record deal with legendary Canadian composer/producer and chairman of Verve Records, David Foster. The 26 year old musician was first brought to Foster's attention through footage of John opening for the legendary Queen of Soul Aretha Franklin at last year's TD Canada Trust Jazz Festival.

Jordan is the son of rock and roll hall of fame bass player Prakash John (George Clinton and Parliament Funkadelic, Alice Cooper and Lou Reed) who acts as bandmate and manager as well as father and mentor. Jordan John and the Blues Angels (Prakash John and Al Cross) can be found playing in and around the Toronto area. They play a regular Monday gig at The Wilson 96 (615 College St. Toronto) and on most Thursdays they can be found at The Bier Markt Esplanade.

In The Studio: Long-time locals The Burgess Brothers have been hard at work in the studio and hope to release their debut recording shortly. A mix of originals and covers, drummer Tyler (ex-Downchild / Stompin' Tom) says the playlist covers a broad spectrum. "We like a lot of different styles, and at this point we're not out to brand ourselves with a particular sound," explains Tyler. "This is what we do, what we like to play, and while we wanted to take our time and get things right, we also wanted to capture the spontaneity and sheer joy of playing live."

The brothers have called on a number of old friends to help out, including Paul Reddick (guitarist/vocalist Chris Burgess was in an early incarnation of Reddick's Sidemen) as well as current Downchild members Michael Fonfara, Pat Carey, and Donny Walsh. Tyler, who also provides harmonica and shares vocal duties with Chris, is excited about a harp duet with Walsh, founder of that venerable blues institution. "It was an honour to play with Donnie," says Tyler, adding that "We've really got a bit of everything on there, from hard-core blues to a bit of country, and the instrumentation ranges from an acoustic outing with Chris on dobro to a full horn section on some cuts."

The brothers ran into technical glitches with the sudden passing of original producer and friend



Honouring Our Own: Juno-winning singer, composer, actor and Canadian television personality Cathy Young is the latest member of the music community to be toasted at an Honouring Our Own tribute concert being held Sat. Young won the very first Juno for Most Promising Female Vocalist Of The Year in 1974 (Ian Thomas was the winner of the Male equivalent award, the categories being merged in 1994) and was also later nominated as Best Female artist.



Her musical pedigree goes back to Yorkville's halcyon days of the early 70s after she arrived in Toronto from western Canada at 16 years of age to become part of a scene that also gave birth to the careers of such Blues and Blues/Rock luminaries as Mike McKenna, Luke Gibson, Pat Little and the Kensington Market band. She celebrated 40 years in the music business with a concert at Hugh's Room in 2010 and was featured in Bruce McDonald's 2011 documentary Toronto Rock & Roll Stories as one of the scene's seminal artists.

McKenna and Little will be performing at the concert among a stellar cast of artists that also includes Shamakah Ali of A Team fame, Debbie Fleming, Johnny Brower and many "surprise" guests. It begins at 7 p.m. in the Black Swan's newly renovated second floor lounge at 154 Danforth Ave. Cover is just \$15 at the door.

The concert is just one of several attractions that are part of organizer Pete Otis' first annual SongTown Toronto Music Festival taking place over the entire weekend on two stages at the club.


The weekend kicks off Fri. Maria Aurigema has toured and played with the likes of Tommy Castro, Kenny Neal and Maria Muldaur and recorded (CD Take Me) with such Canadian homegrown talent as Gary Kendall, Mike Fitzpatrick, Mike Fonfara and Pat Carey of Downchild fame.

Dive House Union, The Blues Hounds and blues great and Buffalo New York born Lucky Peterson will also be featured. 




Julian Fauth Everybody Ought To Treat A Stranger Right Electro-Fi/Outside

A quadruple fracture in the shoulder is major trouble for a piano player but Julian Fauth did not let that stop him from progressing musically. This disc is a major leap from Ramblin' Son, his JUNO-winning second album. The biggest difference is that this is much more a collaborative effort. He started as primarily a solo artist, occasionally with accompanists but he's now playing with 'many great musicians'. Collaborative music is often called jazz and the band tracks feature some wonderful solos, especially from Jay Danley on guitar & Drew Jurecka on his violin. There are horns and backup singers to augment the basic band. His new songs keep it all together, and here there is more continuity with his song subjects as eclectic as before. The straight blues is always present, as is his signature descending piano lick. He picks up his guitar to open, though, with "Window Pane Blues" being an excellent original. The new sound is introduced next with the title song, a gospel classic recorded by Blind Willie Johnson and others getting a cooking new arrangement. "Eyesight To The Blind", "Mean Old Train" and "Roll And Tumble" also get new life with this smoking band. There are plenty of new originals on this generous, 17-song gem, with "So Friggin' Happy" being a delightful neo-Bluebird piano boogie and "Little Soldier" becoming rather more than a song initially meant to make his girlfriend feel better. She should also feel pretty good about "Dimple Nose". Political songs are here too, with "Decisions" tying some very astute but cynical lyrics to a toe-tapping groove. "Angelique" is an ambitious effort about a slave in Montreal who was hung for starting a fire that almost destroyed the city in 1834. I don't have room to write about all the songs

here, although they deserve it. Julian Fauth's songwriting, vocals, choice of musicians all prove he's rapidly becoming one of our major artists, get this disc and I think you'll agree. With his always wonderful sense of humour, he says you should tell him you like the songs even if you don't. Don't worry, you will.




Bill Bourne Songs From A Gypsy Caravan True North/Universal

Last year's Bluesland was the band album, this is the solo one by the veteran Edmonton roots performer who was just here at Hugh's Room with his former Tri-Continental bandmate, Madagascar Slim and Michelle Josef. Always the consummate roots guitarist, his intricate finger picking gets centre stage on songs that take a few listens before you realize how much blues is in them. "Dixie Waltz", "Hand On The Plow" and "Clap For The Healer" are three examples. "We Animal" maintains that for all our denials, we are not that different from animals and underlines that theme with a defiantly dirty electric slide guitar. If these songs are bluesy, then "Queen of Hearts" is the real thing, a doomy slide-heavy masterpiece. Bourne's music has moved well beyond eclectic to a place where labels are meaningless. His 'Official Virtuality' is www. billbourne.com and all of his recordings are available there. Let's hope he's back this way soon.

Corey Lueck and the Smoke Wagon Blues Band It Ain't Easy Indie Pool

Hamilton's best-kept secret is making a move. **The Smoke Wagon Blues Band** has been a mainstay there for well over a decade, releasing independent CDs and graduating from the Hess Street Village scene to larger venues & festivals. The lineup has been unusually steady over that time, with **Corey Lueck** on vocals & harp and **Mike Stubbs** on guitar. They do almost all of the songwriting. **Steve Pritchard** on keyboards, **Gord Aeichele** on bass & sax and **Gavin Robertson** on drums are also long time members. Lueck gets top billing for his fine, whisky-stained vocals and his remarkable way with a blues ballad of which, happily, there are several. We can put this down to the **Rod Stewart** effect. It's but a part of what they call a mix of 'classic R&B, lowdown righteous blues, hypnotizing boogies & barn burners'. Whisky does indeed play a prominent part in their songs and the opener, "Devil Got My Woman" has



her serving him bourbon for breakfast and he's not complaining. "Hold On To You" is one of those ballads, with Pritchard on a string synthesizer. "Josephine" is an excellent grinder and the lead single. Guest Jesse O'Brien adds his inimitable piano/organ. They can do acoustic too, with "Hen House Hopping" serving as a perfect vehicle for Lueck's double entendre lyrics. "Down Hearted Blues" is not quite what you're expecting but an original long, slow blues featuring the horns of the Kingston St. Quartet and a good solo from Stubbs. "It Ain't Easy (to lose the one you love)" is the best of those ballads, with Lueck at his finest and more help from the horns. "That Voodoo" is a duet, Lueck with Robin Banks, over a swampy rhythm cushion. Banks sounds great on these film noir lyrics and Lueck solos powerfully on amplified harp. Add "Damaged Time" to that ballad list. Ms. Banks gets a solo vocal on "Where Did I Go Wrong" as Lueck sits one out in a most generous gesture and she does not disappoint. "Drink By The Sink" is the closer, with Lueck singing through his harp mike over Stubbs' dobro - a gorgeous and all too short slab of country blues. The web site is www.smokewagonbluesband.com and it shows no Toronto dates, maybe we'll just have to go to Hamilton!

Steve Kozak Lookin' at Lucky Self

Veteran Vancouver guitar ace & bandleader Steve Kozak backed LA harpmeister James Harman at the Labatt International Blues Festival in Edmonton a couple of years ago, as he's done on several other occasions; they hit it off so well that Harman guests on and



co-produces Kozak's new disc. Together they've come up with a delightful CD of West Coast swing. The title song is an upbeat little tune about how lucky he is to be playing blues with his friends. It has a lovely, jazzy feel about it, with Chris Nordquist on brushes. While keeping the mood, Harman turns the direction away from Kozak originals to songs by his favourite harp players: Sonny Boy Williamson's "Your Funeral And My Trial" his own "Is It You?", Little Walter's "Little Girl", Big Walter's "Need My Baby", William Clarke's "I Know You're Fine", his own "Read My Mind" and Lazy Lester's "I Hear You Knockin"". With this group playing them, these versions just swing. More excellent Kozak originals are interspersed and his vocals & guitar work spot on. "Lay Low And Go Slow" and "Down At The Barroom" are highlights indeed. You'll be feeling lucky to have this disc, find out more at www. stevekozakmusic.com.



Various Artists ... First Came Memphis Minnie Stony Plain/Warner

Maria Muldaur's recent discs for Stony Plain have featured the female blues pioneers in authentic, acoustic settings that have garnered, and deserved, multiple Grammy and Blues Foundation nominations. One cannot, of course, do that without the songs of Memphis Minnie and Producer Muldaur has drawn from those discs and added new performances from Bonnie Raitt, Ruthie Foster and Rory Block. She also brought in recordings from

Phoebe Snow and Koko Taylor to make for an excellent survey of Memphis Minnie songs. "Me And My Chauffeur", from Richland Woman Blues, was perhaps Minnie's biggest hit and Muldaur performs it effortlessly with Roy Rogers on guitar. Bonnie Raitt's recording career has precluded her doing material such as this so an opportunity to hear her do "Ain't Nothin' In Ramblin" is not to be missed. Steve Freund joins her on guitar. Rorv Block tackles "When You Love Me". accompanying herself on several guitars, a song which may be on loan from a future album in her own blues masters series. The Phoebe Snow contribution is from her 1976 album, It Looks Like Snow - a mesmerizing performance of "In My Girlish Days". "Keep Your Big Mouth Closed" is a rather useful piece of advice captivatingly passed along this time by Ruthie Foster, recorded, as were many of the others in Muldaur's 'Come On In My Kitchen' studio. Choosing a Memphis Minnie song by Memphis-born Koko Taylor was a nice touch and "Black Rat Swing" closes out the program most dramatically and not just because of Bob Margolin's electric slide. It's taken from her 2007 CD on Alligator, Old School. The songs from Muldaur's albums include the duets with Alvin Youngblood Hart as Little Son Joe on "She Put Me Outdoors" & "I'm Goin' Back Home" and three songs featuring the fabulous duo of Steve James & Del Rey. Maria Muldaur is always delightful in this material and this disc proves once again that she belongs in the company of her perhaps more famous guests. She provides a brief biography of her idol in the liner notes and more complete info on all the players. This CD will be in stores on October 9th and according to www. mariamuldaur.com, she'll be at the Sportsmen Tavern in Buffalo on the 15th, the closest she'll get to us so far.

Etta James *Live at Montreux* 1993 (CD & DVD/BRD) Eagle


Last fall's "The Dreamer" was a magnificent swansong to an illustrious career for Etta James. Ace Records in England had already begun a massive re-issue program of her earlier work and now her estate sanctions this generous live package. Etta had appeared at Montreux several times and while this release concentrates on her 1993 show, the excerpts from the other five are quite as good. The CD maxes out at 80 minutes but the DVD/BRD is double that, a feast by any standard and it sells at a very nice price. After a couple of band songs, Etta takes over with "I Just Wanna Make Love To You", (the CD starts here). And take over she does. She dominates the stage and the cameras capture her every move and every bead of sweat - Etta always gave everything she had. "I'd Rather Go Blind', "How Strong



Is A Woman", "A Love Is Forever", "Beware", "Hard To Handle", Just One More Day", "Come To Mama" & "Why I Sing The Blues" show a stunning set list of the new and familiar. The remaining show excerpts, from '75, '77, '78, '89 & '90, lend new meaning to the word 'extras' and despite variations in the quality of the images, provide a fascinating glimpse of Etta at different stages in her career (and of changing fashions). She apparently hated being filmed which might explain why there is only one other DVD available. We owe a very large vote of thanks to **Claude Nobs** of the Montreux Festival for his persistence and to Eagle for providing us with this extravaganza.

Braithwaite and Whiteley "Blues Suite

On Friday, October 19th, Diana Braithwaite and Chris Whiteley will perform their "Blues Suite," live for the first time, at Glenn Gould Studio in Toronto.

The "Blues Suite" is a project three years in development, commissioned by the Toronto Blues Society with support from Canada Council.

It consists of twelve songs written by the two, using traditional blues styles and instruments but reflecting contemporary and personal themes. It will be presented with the help of some of Toronto's top blues musicians.

Fans of blues music in Canada and elsewhere are likely to be quite familiar with the work of Braithwaite and Whiteley. Together they have nine Maple Blues Awards and six nominations. They continue to travel across North America and Europe, appearing at festivals and concerts, and in numerous radio and television appearances.

Praise for the duo is easy to find, but Greg Quill of the Toronto Star probably says it best, describing them as a "joyful collaboration between two prolific high profile members of the blues and roots music scene."

Toronto born and raised, Diana has been called a "national treasure" by Bluz FM radio host Danny Marks. She has worked with such stalwarts as Mel Brown, Albert Collins, John Lee Hooker, and Jeff Healy. Performances all across North America and Europe have led to a well-deserved reputation for Diana as a world-class blues singer.

Kansas born Whiteley moved to Toronto as a youth, where he was taught and encouraged by blues legend Lonnie Johnson. In the 70's he toured and recorded with Leon Redbone, even appearing with him on Saturday Night Live. Chris is a multi-instrumentalist session player, and has won numerous Maple Blues Awards as both a songwriter and Hom Player of the Year.

Together they present authentic, vintage blues and have earned international recognition for recordings on the Electro-Fi label and for their exciting live performances.

In 2010, Chris and Diana won the SOCANsponsored Maple Blues Award for Songwriter of the Year. From there it was an inspired idea to commission them to write a suite of songs in the blues tradition.

As Chris wanted to make clear, the "Blues Suite" is not necessarily intended to cover off a "checklist" of blues styles, but rather to draw on the rich blues tradition to articulate personal themes important to the two performers.

For example, one of the songs is about early

black settlers who came to Canada through the Underground Railroad and settled in Southwestern Ontario, which draws on Diana's family background as a direct descendant of escaped slaves who settled in the Mapleton Township area in Southwestern Ontario.

Many people will, by the way, know that Diana and Chris stage a festival each year to honour the Underground Railroad and the black pioneers who made their way to that region of Ontario in the 19th century.

Another song in the Suite is about Diana's father, a self-made man who worked as a scrap metal dealer. Yet another is on the theme of flooding in Manitoba, which came to mind as the two crossed Canada by train. There is also a song, "Sit Down on the Back Porch," which is pretty much about what you would expect.

As Diana said, this project is about "bringing the blues into the world." It's a unique collaboration, with the support of the Toronto Blues Society and the Canada Council, which will, undoubtedly, expose more people to this vibrant music.

As they want to make very clear, it's a lyrically diverse project using a range of blues styles, but it definitely about the blues.

Again, the date to remember is Friday, October 19th at the Glenn Gould Studio for Diana Braithwaite's and Chris Whiteley's "Blues Suite," with Diana providing incredible vocals and Chris on vocals, guitar, trumpet and harmonica.

Joining them will be Vince Maccarone on drums; Ron Johnson on Bass, Jesse Whiteley on piano, Neil Braithwaite on tenor sax, Phil Skladowski on baritone sax; and special guest Dan Whiteley on mandolin.

Tickets are available through the Massey Hall box office. If you are a Charter Member of the

It'll be a great show.




