

## The Dominion on Queen

The word Dominion, has been in use in Canada since 1867 when we became the Dominion of Canada. When a hotel was built at the corner of Queen and Sumach, the Dominion Hotel, not surprisingly in those days, was the name chosen. Next door to the hotel was the Dominion Brewery, which delivered its lagers and porters to the hotel.

Since 1998 The Dominion on Queen has been owned by the Duranovich family, with Sean managing this good local bar, that has a grand red limestone & brick exterior, in Corktown (named after County Cork because Irish immigrants populated the neighborhood). The Dominion has been a musical oasis east of Yonge for many years now.

In the past few weeks Sean has been starting a new blues policy with Toronto Blues Society moving their Thursday Blues Series to the Dominion. Chris Antonik opened the series on January 16th to an appreciative audience, in the bartender's words, with Jack de Keyzer, Suzie Vinnick, Curley Bridges, Morgan Davis and Harrison Kennedy rounding out the musicians for February to June. An extremely talented group of musicians to draw in the crowds and make for as good an evening of blues as can be found in Toronto, especially with no cover charge for any of these evenings.

Sean is adding to his Dominion blues lineup with a Saturday show, Blues & Troubles started the series on January 25th, with that week a Friday bonus of D.B. Buxton. February 8th sees James Anthony's CD release party and on the 15th is the TBS Harmonica Workshop, hosted by Carlos del Junco and featuring Jerome Godboo, Roly Platt & Mike Stevens, always a great event especially for harp and budding harp players.

For the first Saturday each month, starting in March Paul James and his band will be playing and on the third Saturday monthly D.B. Buxton brings his Sonic Blues BBO to the stage. Al Lerman is booked for March 29th and we can expect to see more quality blues acts added on an ongoing basis.

Dan Ackroyd, Sean told me, lived across the street from the Domion and was a frequenter of the bar and has recommended it in print. With the Dan Ackroyd wines being promoted in MapleBlues, Sean is hoping to get some spin-off or recommendation from Dan that will help the Dominion promote the blues events.

A raised stage in the main room, and a back room that hosts The Wee Folk Club, two Thursdays a month makes music a big part of the raison d'etre of The Dominion. Hot Club of Corktown has a "Django Jam" every Tursday, The Corktown Ukulele Jam on Wednesdays draws a large following of that instrument, Sunday Rockabilly Brunch sometimes followed by an afternoon jazz set and on the 16th of February D.B. Buxton performs at night. On February 22 the Don River Blues Band will perform. For this writer Sean is to be commended for making music a big reason to head to The Dominion.

Internationally renowned Canadian blues artists from Coast-to-Coast were honoured by their peers at the 17th Annual Maple Blues Awards gala in Toronto as a full house of blues lovers gathered to celebrate Canadian blues at Koerner Hall.

Ottawa's MonkeyJunk and its members took home five awards, including Entertainer of the Year, Electric Act of the Year, Recording of the Year for All Frequencies, Songwriter of the Year and Harmonica Player of the Year for Steve Marriner.

Quebec's thriving blues scene was well represented with awards for Dawn Tyler Watson and Paul Deslauriers for Acoustic Act of the Year, and Guitar Player of the Year for Deslauriers and Angel Forrest for Female Vocalist of the Year. Presented by television personality George Stroumboulopoulos, and Yves Trottier of Dawg FM, Quebec singer-quitarist Bob Walsh was honoured with the Blues With a Feeling (Lifetime Achievement) Award for his long career as a blues performer and helping to put Quebec blues in the spotlight provincially and nationally. The New Artist or Group of the Year award was presented to Owen Sound, Ontario's The MacKenzie Blues Band. The Tim Hortons Southside Shuffle and its team received the Blues Booster of the Year award, a very special Maple Blues Award honouring outstanding contribution to the Canadian blues music industry for their contribution as a popular festival and destination for blues lovers.

MonkeyJunk, The 24th Street Wailers, Charlie A'Court from Nova Scotia, David Vest from British Columbia, and Little Miss Higgins from Saskachewan, all did great performances backed by The Maple Blues Band featuring Gary Kendall, Michael Fonfara, Teddy Leonard, Al Lerman, Tom Bona, Chris Whiteley, Pat Carey and Chris Murphy.







Congratulations to Jerome Godboo, the TBS entrant in the 30th International Blues Challenge who will bring home the Lee Oskar Harmonica Player Award. The IBC is the world's largest gathering of blues acts presenting five days of music on world famous Beale Street in downtown Memphis with a full day of performances before a full house at the Orpheum Theatre. Narrowed from a record 255 acts from 40 states and 16 countries (and four continents), the 8 solo/ duo and 9 band finalists vied for the top prizes before an esteemed panel of judge. Canadians fared well with Calgary's Tim Williams Band taking first place in the solo/duo category. Winner in the band category was Mr. Sipp, who also received the Gibson Guitarist Award.

Meanwhile at the Grammies, Ben Harper With Charlie Musselwhite took home the Best Blues Album Award for *Get Up!* and Clifton Chenier received a Lifetime Achievement Award.

Guitar Awards Honour Domenic Troiano: The Domenic Troiano Guitar Scholarship, created in 2006 to honour the legacy of this extraordinary Canadian music legend, has become the Domenic Troiano Guitar Awards. Three \$5,000 prizes will be awarded to Canadian guitarists in the categories of Jazz, Multi-Genre (Rock, Blues, R&B, Country, etc.) and Classical, with trophies designed by Istvan Fujkin. The deadline for submissions of one 3 to 4 minute performance on video to Sonicbids is Friday, March 28, 2014. For application criteria visit domenictroiano.com.

The cash prizes and trophies will be presented with performances by the award winners at the first annual Domenic Troiano Guitar Awards Dinner at Hugh's Room in Toronto.

Credited by many as the catalyst of the "Toronto Sound' in the 1960's, Domenic Troiano played a principle role in Mandala, The James Gang, Bush and The Guess Who. He was inducted into the Canadian Music Hall of Fame in 1996 and scored multiple movie and television themes including 'Night Heat', 'Diamonds' and 'Hot Shots' and played on recordings by Diana Ross, Joe Cocker, Donald Fagan, David Clayton-Thomas, Etta James, Ronnie Hawkins, James Cotton and Long John Baldry. Three Dog Night, Skylark and John Rutledge have recorded his songs.

Says RUSH's Alex Lifeson, "On June 30, 1967, I saw the Mandala at the North York Centennial Arena. At the side of the stage Donny gave me his autograph and his Mandala button. He told me how important it

was to keep practicing and if I worked hard, I might get the chance to stand on stage and play for people some day. I was beaming. He was my first real inspiration and to this day I have a deep love and admiration for a man who truly knew the meaning of soul. I am proud to be a humble part of his enduring influence".



This month the Voxxy Lady, Rita di Ghent presents the first of a series called "Vanishing Ladies"

To most fans of jazz and blues, Pinetop Perkins, Otis Spann, Little Brother Montgomery,

Memphis Slim, Fats Waller, Earl Hines, and Art Tatum are household names. Fortunately, their legacies have been preserved and we can continue to enjoy their work well after their deaths. Here's the question, though: Where are the women players? That all blues piano greats were men is unlikely, especially given that the piano was considered a "feminine" instrument (and therefore



somewhat stigmatizing if you were a male player). However, if early women blues Greats did exist, why have they seemingly "vanished" from our musical consciousness?

I spent several weeks trailing meager clues and emailing obscure authors to uncover whatever I could about history's female blues piano masters. As it turns out, prodigious women players existed a-plenty. Their legacies, however, failed to endure. I'm thrilled that the Maple Blues editors got behind the idea of featuring several of these "Vanishing Ladies" in upcoming issues of the Newsletter. This issue features the "Brown Bomber of Sophisticated Rhythm"--Gladys Bentley.

Bentley was born on August 12, 1907 in Pennsylvannia to an American father and a Trinidadian mother. She was an authoritative piano player with a deep, bluesy Bessie Smith-like voice. Promo pictures show her dressed up in white top hat and tails. We learn from wikipedia that she had headlined at the Ubangi Club in Harlem (backed by a chorus of drag queens) where she sang raunchy numbers and flirted with women patrons. Bentley also held court at another Harlem venue called The Clam House, a "long, narrow room on 133rd Street's Jungle Alley", which was described in Vanity Fair as "a popular house for revelers but not for the innocent young." Although she was openly gay, Bentley underwent a "conversion"

during the McCarthy era. She studied to be a minister, started wearing dresses, and claimed to have been "cured" of lesbiansism via female hormone therapy.

By the grace of a singular youtube video, we can now witness rare footage of Bentley's masterly playing. She appears uncomfortably "smocked up and sassed down" in a segment from Groucho Marx's "You Bet Your Life". In her interview with Marx, she tersely plugs her biography, "If This Be Sin" which, I suspect, would be about her life as a lesbian.

In the video, Bentley and Marx kibbitz for

a bit, and then a portable piano is rolled out from backstage. Bentley balances her 300 pounds teeteringly on the piano stool and then rips into a lightning fast version of "Them There Eyes". She's got a left hand that any modern-day piano player would kill for, and her right hand is effortlessly fleet and accurate. For reasons difficult for us to understand today, the producers have a man in African garb cavort about the set during the song. However, Bentley, the consummate entertainer, seems unfazed by this bit of ludicrous theatricality, smiling, singing and playing

brilliantly with total ease.

Bentley's only or remaining (I don't know which) eight recordings for the OKEH label are available only as MP3 downloads on Amazon. Also appearing on Amazon is an entry for a Tuff City outing called "Select Singles, The Gladys Bentley Quintet", but it is marked ``unavailable``. On the OKEH outing,

Bentley's work is paired with that of Maggie Jones (whose work assumes tracks 1-16), an African American musician who recorded 38 sides in total during her career. Billed as "The Texas Nightengale", her voice is high, bell-like, and polished, possessing a flexible vibrato

Bentley's voice, featured on tracks 17 to 24, is lower, more muscular, and effected with growls and trumpet imitations. Her material is more straight-up blues than Jones'. She takes a break from the piano on tracks 21 and 22 and sings with just guitar. The guitarist (Eddie Lang?) provides driving and sophisticated accompaniment, filling the spaces between vocal phrases with ascending arpeggios and chords the likes of which pre-sage jazz playing.

Although Bentley's career is scantily documented, we fortunately have youtube and the OKEH release to give us a glimpse into both her prowess and her rightful place in the pantheon of great blues players. Enjoy this master--and spread the word!






Matt Andersen Weightless Stubby Fingers/True North/Universal


Multiple MBA winner Matt Andersen has landed himself a major new distribution deal, with a major jump in the production budget. For a performer I've really only experienced solo, Weightless a huge departure. Each song is built around his voice and guitar but a full electric band, often with horns and backup singers, is the norm here. The forces are all marshaled by one of the finest producers in the business, Steve Berlin, of Los Lobos fame in his performing career. Andersen's songwriting has always been his strong suit, along with his powerful performances of them. He has upped the ante this time, getting collaborators for each song and most of them are fellow Maritimers, as are the basic players. As might be expected, the musical mainstream is the goal, but four of the songs are solid blues and at a private solo performance for the media, he showed how bluesy all these songs could be. The opener, "I Lost My Way" (written with Joel Plaskett) is one of the four, it's as good a description of losing your way as you could want. "Weightless" (with Ryan Hupman) is a lovely slab of R&B about leaping into something new. (Mike Stevens gets a harp solo) "Let You Down" (with Keith Mullins) is a clever song about how he'll treat a new flame. "City of Dreams" (with Hamilton's Tom Wilson) is the best of the four, a remarkably effective lament for a retiring union man in a city that is also be facing the end of its industrial life. (Geoff Arsenault's drumming delivers an extra dimension here). "Drift Away" (with Suzie

Vinnick) is a tender ballad with some advice to help you sleep. The production is faultless, the vocals beautifully done, the songs excellent. The recording was done in Halifax, the horns were added in Austin, the recordings mixed in California and mastered in Nashville, making this album a major leap of faith and if he's feeling weightless, he needn't worry. As usual for this road warrior, there is a lengthy tour to support the album and you can find out when he's in your town at www. stubbyfingers.ca. Our date is Massey Hall on March 1. Be there.



The Perpetrators Stick 'Em Up Perps

It's been a few years but The Perpetrators are back. You'll remember the Winnipeg-based alt blues trio that loved to play Hound Dog Taylor in their sets and captured that reckless abandon. Well, that spirit is still there. Jay Nowicki is still there on vocals & guitars, as is Ryan Menard on bass and Ken McMahon on drums, both members of the Rocking Highliners before that. Winnipeg scene veteran John Scoles, in whose club they were the house band, also helps out on bass and Romi Mayes does some harmony vocals (Nowicki toured with Mayes in 2011). "Sweetgrass" channels Chuck Berry to announce their return and their return to the road, with that battered suitcase telling you all you need to know. "Spend More Money (Than I've Got)" is a slower grinder that should resonate with most every listener. A slow blues about a wandering girl friend that taps back into that Hound Dog slide is "You've Got To Tell Me" - a keeper for sure. The slide stays on, backed by piledriver drums, for a half-spoken tale of a robbery attempt Nowicki experienced. Anger may not have been the best response seeing as he'd just spent all his money on "Smokes & Chicken". They can do Hill Country too and "Shake It" should do just as well in filling that dance floor. This is dirty blues, full of raw energy and with the talent to make it work. It's got them a JUNO nomination and a Western Canada Music Award in the past. This one should do just as well. The web site is www.theperps.ca.




Brian Cober Austin Wired Self

Brian Cober is a charter member of the Kensington Market community and has hosted an evening jam at Grossman's Tavern for longer than anyone can remember. He's also played the Montreal Jazz Festival, toured Europe & Israel and tours throughout the province and south of the border as well. He loves to play slide quitar, in fact he plays double slide, one on his thumb and over the top of the neck.

With fellow veterans Big Ben Richardson on bass and Tom Lewis on drums, he took a new set of songs to the Wire studio in Austin TX to take advantage of the vibe in that music city. It was a good plan (and a good album title). "What Will Come" is an excellent rocker looking into the future now that his woman has left. "Preaching The Blues (Blues Walking Like A Man)" is the RI composition, which gets a patented and fast double slide arrangement. As he explains in his liner note, Cober says the subtitle is what he thinks was RJ's actual song title. After two fast ones, "I'm A Bluesman, Baby" slows things down a bit. It's the kind of song he would sing to a certain person in the audience and it's a good one too. "Nuestro Viento" is a latin-tinged slide instrumental that adds a nice touch of variety.

"Run And Hideaway" has an attractive melody, a radio-friendly song about wanting to run off with a rich man's daughter. Some very good new songs to play in the sets at Grossman's on Sunday nights, next time you're there and better yet, go to the CD Release Party at LOLA, 40 Kensington Ave on Thursday, February 13. André Bisson Bad Scene Self

This Hamilton-based band's horn-based retro soul moves markedly forward with an all-original program by Bisson, the bandleader, vocalist and guitar player and sometime piano player. One listen, though, will tell you that he has a fine group of willing accomplices on board. Add in a couple of guests and you can transport yourself right back to the Club Bluenote. "Bad Scene" serves up a slab of funk for the opener. "Wasting Time" & "Timeless Love" keep the groove going with gorgeous melodies, something Bisson excels at.

Two songs that emphasize the blues part of R&B are "When I'm Gone", and "Soul Survivor", a new song that may be the album's best, with solid lyrics, a dramatic arrangement and a horn chart to match. It also has some fine keyboard work from Jesse O'Brien and a remarkable guitar solo from Bisson, virtually the only one he allows himself. "Never Let Me Go" & "Remember" are two more memorable soul tunes on a disc full of them.

Bisson is a very good singer, he writes excellent songs and the **J-Tones** are a very good band. They are: **Matt Burns** on drums & percussion; **Brad Cheeseman**, Bass; **Loretta Hale**, trumpet; & **Francis Smith** on saxes. **Darcy Hepner**, **Andrew King**, and **Kevin Matthews** take some of the sax solos. Www.andrebisson.ca has links to get their discs but shows no Toronto dates, just gigs in Hamilton and area until they return to the British Isles for another tour in March.

John Hammond Timeless Palmetto/ Sony

John Hammond has been coming to Toronto since the early Mariposa Festivals, he knew about Levon & The Hawks before Dylan did and his use of them for one his LPs may well have influenced Dylan's decision to go with them. Hammond's

annual visit is coming up, Feb 27 & 28 at Hugh's Room, and he has a new live CD and a new contract to celebrate along with his 50th anniversary as a performer. His debut Palmetto release, distributed by Sony, was recorded at one of his favourite clubs, Chan's in Woonsocket, Rhode Island last May. And live is the best way to enjoy his music - he has always had an uncanny ability to hold audiences spellbound, no mean feat for an acoustic artist in this amplified world. I once witnessed a concert at the Chicago Blues Festival where you could hear a pin drop among 250,000 people. He does that here too, in a program that draws from his 35 earlier albums. In many cases these were band tracks and you'll be reminded of what musical feats he can accomplish with his guitar, a rack-mounted harp and that marvelous, weathered voice. Those earlier discs were



the introduction for many of us to some of the best country blues ever recorded, as well as some Chicago blues songs he was performing before the world knew about them. Latterly, his friendship with Tom Waits has introduced a contemporary dimension and two Waits songs are included here. Also more recently he has started recording some of his own compositions and his "Heartache Blues" gets a live treatment here. Choosing highlights is pretty much a useless exercise, but Skip James' "Hard Times" might be one and his solo version of Bobby Bland's "Further On Up The Road" another. Hammond is a giant in the blues pantheon and this disc will show you why. It will also show you what an artist of his stature & experience can bring to these songs. You can check to see how many of those 35 albums you have at www. johnhammond.com, and all his tour dates are there too.
