

After that fateful night, David's career continued on a successful path, opening for Bobby "Blue" Bland, Big Bill Morganfield and Sue Foley, before taking a self-imposed hiatus in 2007 to focus on family. David's newest recording, "Livin Life,"



celebrates his long awaited return to recording and performing. Jenie Thai (Opening for David) was born in Chiang Mai Thailand, and raised outside of Edmonton, Jenie Thai is building a musical presence throughout the country through the electric energy she displays on stage and the old soul that's conveyed through her song writing.



Ken Whiteley | October 21 @ 8:00 pm



Blues + Soul + Afro-Roots =

Cécile Doo-Kingué

A unique sound, and exceptional stage presence, singer, songwriter and guitarist, Cécile has been sharing that distinctiveness exclusively since here debut solo release *Freedom Calling* in 2010. Born and raised in New York City, Cécile Doo-Kingué is a first generation American born to Cameroonian parents who has now decided to call Montreal her hometown.

Considered one of Canada's most electrifying and versatile guitarists, Cécile Doo-Kingué has shared stages with many acclaimed artists, opening for Canned Heat and others along the way. In 2011, CBC commissioned Doo-Kingué to write *Home*,

a song on immigration. Soon after, she released *Gris* (2012), which earned her the 2013 SPACQ Foundation Edith Butler Award for Excellence in Franocphone Songwriting. Her efforts have led Cécile to her most recent release, *Anybody Listening Pt. 1: Monologues* (February 2015), which is the first installment of a trilogy that explores blues, roots and the various aspects of life.

For this edition of Notes & Quotes, Cécile Doo-Kingué delves into who she is as an artist, what life is like on the road, and what is on the horizon for her as she navigates life through her musical endeavours.

Cécile started playing music at a young age, influenced by her brother, who gave Doo-Kingué her first guitar when she was twelve. When asked, she says, "Holy epiphany, Batman! I started playing lead after he gave me 2 cassettes: Freddie King and T-Bone Walker. From there I explored more of the blues, jazz, soul, rock and world greats... When I was fifteen, I went to study in Paris where I was accepted into the school's jazz band. It was my first time playing and making music in a band setting. I've wanted to be a professional musician ever since."

In addition to what she offers listeners on *Monologues*, Doo-Kingué has an impressive multi-instrumental skillset. "I play bass, and

started playing drums when I was working on Freedom Calling. I asked Graham Chambers to borrow a few cymbals so I could record some colors for the album. He leant me a 24" Pearl Export from the 70's with a ride, hats and a Slingerland snare. Little did he know he was getting me hooked on an 8h/day habit! I get by on keys... One of my regrets is not having maintained my piano skills."


Something that separates Cécile from other artists is her easily recognizable sound -- a blend of afro-roots, soul and blues music. When asked if the process of finding her sound was organic or an intentional fusion, Cécile says, "I never looked for a sound. Whatever comes out of me stems from all the music I've heard since I was in my mother's womb, filtered through the multicultural lens of my up-bringing. I'm a born and raised New Yorker. Both my parents were born and raised in Cameroon, had 6 of my 7 siblings in France, so when they immigrated to the States, they chose to keep educating their kids in French. I was raised in 3 cultures, exposed to music from literally all over the world. All of us are music lovers so I've been listening to jazz, classical, blues, soul, rock, folk, African, Caribbean, Latin, Brazilian music, chanson française, etc., since before I was born, Since moving to Montreal, I've been exposed to




Ria Reece Band Out All Night Disco Fairy

This young Montreal vocalist is rapidly building a name for herself, already winning two Ouebec Lys Awards. They were for Breakout Artist and, for her first CD, the award for Best Blues & Associated Styles, the awards' catchall term for nontraditional blues. They were finalists at last year's Talent Search leading to her well-received appearance at Blues Summit 7. At their web site, they call their music Alternative Rhythm & Blues, but Ms. Reece's haunting vocals fit this column perfectly. André Chevarie is the excellent quitarist, song co-writer with Ms. Reece & producer and he also handles the label. Bass chores are well handled by Sylvain Lamothe and drums are by Martin Laporte and they provide all the support she needs. It's billed as a band and it deserves to be. "(Maybe) The Dark (will follow me home)" is a gorgeous opener, an ambitious mid tempo rocker that shows off Ms. Reece's multi-octave and expressive voice. Guest slide guitarist Pat Loiselle is there for every twist & turn. "Think I Fell In Love (Again)" shows a lighter, jazzier touch with Guy Bélanger questing on harp. After a couple funky things we get a slow blues, "Anybody?", a plea for help in these dark days. J-P Bouffard guests on organ. Bouffard's organ underpins "One Foot In The Grave", another highlight that brings to mind the Carolina Chocolate Drops' version of "Hit 'Em Up Style", a fine song. If "The Dark" was good enough to be released as a single, "A Thing Called Love" actually was released as the first single a month or so ago. It again features Bélanger and Bouffard but more to the point features




Michael Schatte Turn Back The Vikings

The winner of this year's Talent Search is not usually called a bluesman, although he also was a finalist in this year's International Blues Challenge in Memphis. And yet Turn Back The Vikings shows that blues is an integral part of his eclectic repertoire. He plays guitar mostly, and he does that very well, but he also plays keyboards, violin, bass, drums, hammered dulcimer, banjo and mandolin. He's also a very good entertainer, songwriter and singer. Randy Cassidy plays bass & helped with the production. Chad Davis plays drums on most of the songs but other drummers play on several songs. Schatte starts off album #4 with some good old-fashioned rock 'n roll: "The Rehabilistate" claims that you can do just about anything you want, all you need is good lawyers to escape punishment -very well played if not entirely something one can agree with. "Honey Doll" is a very attractive acoustic blues with a prominent mandolin part. "Odessa" is a little blast of rockabilly. "Pistol On Her Pillow" is a fine bluesy rocker, as is "All For Me" and "Bring You Around". Several of the other songs reveal a serious debt to Richard Thompson but that's not a problem for me because I'm a fan of his as well. He has been getting a fair amount of work recently but you can catch him at the Canal Bank Shuffle in Thorold on Saturday, October 17th and at Monarch's Pub in November. David Owen Livin' Life Owensound

During the glory days of the Silver Dollar, **David Owen** was a young country blues player just in from Ottawa firmly in the John Hammond tradition, opening for visiting acts. He subsequently left public performance to work for the blues community in another way: his postering company, Grassroots Advertising, has flourished. He also raised a family north of Toronto. He's now ready to resume his career and shows that he's a mature artist and a very capable songwriter. He's brought along some invaluable assistance as well, with Jimmy Bowskill on various stringed things & harmony vocals, Alec Fraser on his percussive brush bass and behind the glass, producer Gary Kendall. The ten-song program is all original, with many, well-incorporated borrowings from the blues & roots tradition. "Highway Driver" is a very good opener, a toe-tapper of a road song with Bowskill on mandolin. There are several songs that are strikingly original including the title song, a wellwritten tale of the realization that this lifestyle isn't sustainable. "Every Piece of My Heart" has a gorgeous melody to go along with a lovely lyric and Bowskill on violin, a touch of genius. There's a country feel to this one and "The Truth" is a full out country song with Bowskill on pedal steel. "My Sweet Rider" adds electric guitar to the mix and concludes the disc with some of Owen's most impassioned singing. It's an excellent conclusion to a mostly acoustic, very enjoyable disc. David Owen is back and one can only hope there are more discs to come. You can celebrate his return and pick up the disc at the CD Release Party at the Jazz Bistro on Oct 14, a TBS Hump Wednesday exclusive. André Bisson Left With The Blues Self

Not so well known here but a fixture of the Hamilton blues/R&B scene, André Bisson, who just won the Male Vocalist of the Year at the Hamilton Blues Awards, has an impressive sixth disc for us. Left With The Blues is also a hugely ambitious effort, with a large cast to augment the basic five-piece band. And once again this young man has come up with some excellent songs as a strong foundation. "Left With The Blues" is the opener with all the forces present, beautifully arranged & recorded. It's a slow blues with three more horns augmenting Bill Holinaty's tenor & Loretta Hale's cello. There are keyboards and backup vocalists but Bisson's tale of a love gone bad is front & centre. He could have won that award on this song alone. "Borrowed Time" rocks out with Bisson's guitar as the featured instrument with all those horns riffing away. Jerome Godboo's harp is featured on "Deepest Kind of Mean", about a sweet talking woman who isn't what she appears to be. The one non-original is a very good version of "Crosscut Saw". "Brand New Day" adds even more vocalists for a gospel rave up and a fine way to end the disc. The other songs showcase his facility with a wide variety of R&B styles on this excellent disc. Jesse O'Brien on keys is perhaps the only name in this stellar cast you might recognize, an indication, I think, of the Hamilton's vibrant music scene. Jay Sewall Duets 1 Self

Quebec harmonica wizard, **Jay Sewall**, a lifetime-achievement-award winning veteran, has a new disc that showcases his vocals and harmonica in the company of some of Quebec's blues & folk stars. He also adds acoustic guitar to his repertoire and

other instruments come in as necessary. Stephen Barry duets on the first of the mostly original compositions by Sewall, "I'm A Lonesome Cat". With just guitar, bass & harmonica, this is a lovely acoustic performance. "Shabby Doo Bop" is a delightful New Orleans style song with Monya Mathieu dueting, accompanied




by second line drums and trombone from Geneviève Duval and tenor sax by David Parker. Michael Jerome Browne contributes vocals on perhaps the most serious song here, a mournful "Hobo Joe (Moanin')". Sewall's harmonica is dramatically effective. Women's Blues Revue alumna Valérie Clio duets on "Let Your Ego Go", a bit of what Sewall calls New Orleans reggae, with the horns soloing nicely. Michael Goudreau guests on the rockabilly "Take A Chance". First Nations rhythms propel "Run Indian Run" done with drummer Barry Nameth, the story of Gun-an-noot, who was falsely accused of murdering two white men. He was finally vindicated but the being on the run for thirteen years led to his death soon after, another more serious song on a mostly whimsical disc. His Amos Garrett-like vocals are very pleasing and the harmonica playing of course peerless. Several of the guests were new to me but no longer. There are a couple of web sites but www.jaysewall.bandcamp.com is where limited streaming and downloads are available.

Mud Bay Blues Band Colebrook Road Self

The regional nature of our blues scene is a source of constant frustration. The **Mud Bay Blues Band** from Vancouver has been active for 37 years and just came to my attention with this disc brought during a visit from guitarist **Mark Branscombe**, who, inevitably, has family here. The other guitarist is **Randall T Carpenter**;

bandleader & harpist, 'Mud Bay Slim'; bass, Bob Petterson and drums, Murphy Farrell. They most all sing and write but each of their contributions to Colebrook Road sound remarkably consistent, no doubt the product of all that time together. The rocking "All I Want Is You", with its stop time verses, is a showcase for that two guitars plus harp sound. And as if that sound wasn't full enough, they add a smartly arranged horn section for "Hellbent" and ${\bf Peter\,Sweetzir}$ adds organ, the first of several appearances. "40 Days And 40 Nights" is a remarkable power ballad by Carpenter, with Aiden Farrell on harmony vocals. The horns are back with that B3 for a gorgeous, full sound. The title



song refers to a place where bad things happen and judging by this performance you may not want to ever find yourself on Colebrook Road. A horn-led soul ballad (plus that B3) ends the disc, "Nothing But The Blues" has Carpenter lamenting most effectively that that's all he has left now that she's gone. There are traces of their love of Chicago blues here and there but the songs are original, uniformly well written and imaginatively arranged. On their web site they refer to themselves as the band that won't go away, well now that I know about them, I certainly hope they don't. The songs stream at their web site, www. mudbayblues.com and at CDBaby.



CBC. He was also Executive Director of the Western Canadian Music Alliance and the BreakOut West Festival, Conference and the Western Canadian Music Awards. Most recently, he has served as the Executive Director of MusicOntario.

CMW also announced the appointment of **Cameron Wright** as Vice President of Operations and Live Programming. In this role Cameron will oversee all aspects of the festival and additionally assist with programming in the Live Touring Music Summit. This position marks Wright's return to Canadian Music Week having previously held the role of Festival Director for five years before moving to Live Nation in 2014.

And Canadian recording industry pioneer Deane Cameron moves into the world of live music presentation as the new President and CEO of The Corporation of Massey Hall and Roy Thomson Hall. After a 35 year tenure with the company, Cameron resigned as president and CEO of EMI Music Canada in 2012 as the storied British music firm was merged into Universal Music's holdings. Cameron headed the Canadian operation for 28 years and prior to that ran the label's A&R division, working with acts including Helix, Lisa Dalbello, Luba, Prism, and Streetheart. In an earlier day he was a musician, playing drums in various bands with Tom Cochrane who went on to have a long and successful career with the label. Cameron is a member of The Order of Canada - and has been celebrated by the Juno Awards with the Walt Grealis Special Achievement Award. He has also been a longstanding supporter of the arts and culture of Aboriginal communities.

RIP Bill Powell: A mainstay of the Hamilton roots music scene, Bill Powell ran a popular coffee house in Hamilton and was the founding director of Festival of Friends in Hamilton and ran it from 1976 to 2000. Bill highly supported the Hamilton arts community and advised many. His loss is huge in Hamilton. Bill also ran the Earthsong event and Buskingfest in Dundas. He was 76

country, and various Canadian music, both in English and in French. All of it comes out in what I play, compose and write. I love tradition but I am more interested in evolution and bastardization. All modern music comes from a meeting of cultures, including the blues. My sound is as much of a cocktail as I am."

When asked what it is that she most wants people to walk away from her music with, Cécile says, "Communion. Authenticity. Joy. Food for thought. Social awareness. The feeling and understanding that we are all interconnected through something that transcends what we know, how we look, our native tongue, our skin tone, our religion, our social class, our gender, our sexuality, etc., —not necessarily in that order."

Her experience paints a vivid picture of comradery and life as a touring artist: "It can be heaven or it can be hell, depending on whom you travel with... (Laughs). I've made a point of only working with musicians that I love as human beings first and foremost. If we don't have chemistry as people, we won't have it on stage either, and the music and show will suffer from it. To me music and live performance are something extremely intimate and beautiful; I wouldn't want to soil the experience with any negativity. The road has been an amazing place to forge my trios' camaraderie and sense of family. You learn to

have each other's back on all levels. We are one off stage, we are one on stage. I'm blessed to work with people who take care of me as much as I take care of them. We laugh a lot and we communicate. That's key! Sometimes it (the road) gets a bit overwhelming because I'm my own manager, tour manager, producer, etc. This past summer's run was beautifully intense. (Cécile toured from Montreal to Vancouver and performed 40 shows in 6 weeks, and continued recording throughout that process.) That being said, I love traveling. Alone and with people. I love learning empirically, through meeting people, learning about Canada, the world, different cultures and spaces in real time - not from a book or bias-skewed news report or media. I love the road. As tiring as it may sometimes be, I'll burn rubber until my body calls it quits. I love playing to new audiences. One of my favourite feelings happens when I'm playing to a cold crowd and all of a sudden, usually during the first song, complicity sets in between the stage and the audience. I love reconnecting with previously made fans. I love playing workshops at folk festivals. The road extends the wonderful communion born from a live show. There's always a mourning period when I come off a tour."


The first single from her soon to be released *Anybody Listening Pt. 2: Dialogues* (due out January 2016) will be released next month, just in time for her debut at the

Toronto Blues Society's 29th Annual Women's Blues Revue at Massey Hall on November 28th. When asked about the upcoming show, she says, "One: I'm stoked about sharing the stage and communing with remarkable talent. Added bonus: it's an all women show. Sexuality jokes aside, why is it an added bonus? It features women instrumentalists. We are underrepresented and more often than not, overlooked and under-appreciated in an industry that unfortunately still reflects an old boys' club mentality. I dream of a day when hearing a woman kick ass on an instrument that was 'traditionally male' will no longer be a novelty. We're still assumed or expected to be singers, especially on the blues scene, despite all the killer instrumentalists out there. Two: Massey Hall. It's one of my bucket list venues."

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
