

Roly Platt Inside Out rolyplatt.com & Guy Bélanger Blues Turn Bros - Two of Canada's harmonica masters released recordings this year: Platt's début ("one every 56 years"), and Bélanger's newest, recorded in Montréal, Toronto, and Chicago; both are versatile players with taste and feel, both feature instrumental tracks as well as vocals, with genre variety.


Mark Rheaume reviews CDs for CBC's Fresh Air and manages the CBC Library:

Lenny Solomon The Blues Violin Self - He's an award




winner for his jazz skills, but the Toronto veteran bowman plays everything from jump blues to country blues on his lilting fourth recording as a group leader. Solomon also makes forays into R&B, soul, and pop, but shines brightest – and lives up to the album title – when his mood turns to the blues.

Michael Jerome Browne Sliding Delta Borealis - Very much in solo form on the new disc, accompanying himself on six and twelve-string guitar, banjo, mandolin, and harp, Browne released one of the finest purely acoustic blues albums of the year. Traditionalists will love his interpretations of old time tunes as much the project's stark simplicity: all of the tracks were recorded live off the floor over three days.



Dione Taylor Born Free Matay - Also known more as a jazz singer, Taylor nevertheless finds her blues - and gospel - form on her short but mighty third solo album. Wonderful, uptempo, percussion-powered acoustic blues.

Sugar Brown *Poor Lazarus* Self - This raw and dynamic fourteen-song set was recorded live off the floor, in mono and on to tape. For sheer sound and selection of original numbers and classics, no blues recording pleased these ears more in 2015.



John Mayall Find a Way to Care Forty Below - Is Mayall really over 80? He still sounds remarkably like the leader of the mid-Sixties **Bluesbreakers** outfit that first drew many newcomers to the blues. It says a lot for Mayall – and the blues in general – that one of 2015's finest new offerings was from one of its oldest practitioners.

Various Artists Acoustic Blues Bear Family (four 2CD sets from 20's to 90's). Released over the last couple of years by my favorite re-issue label. Each decade is well curated and represented by 24 tracks.

Peter Guralnick "Sam Phillips - The Man Who Invented Rock & Roll" Little, Brown & Company - Peter Gulalnick had a close relationship with **Sam Phillips** and of course wrote the two best books on **Elvis**.

Dinner and a night on the town with Richard Flohil (Canada's blues Ambassador) - Richard is always a goldmine of blues information, good will and first hand stories. Just don't go to a vegetarian restaurant. Contact me at stonyplainrecords. com.

Sharon Jones & The Dap-Kings It's A Holiday Soul Party (Daptone) - Silent night? Well, yes and no. The unstoppable Sharon Jones and her Brooklyn funk-soul brothers do time-tested carols but not in the **Bing Crosby** way. On a festive and funky LP, there is no rest to ye merry gentleman, while an original, "Ain't No Chimneys in the Projects", gives pause for thought.

2016 Blues Images Calendar & 20-Track CD (Alligator) - An artful almanac looks back (at old-timey blues artists and

events) and plans forward as well. While listening to the definitely misbehaving Ma Rainey or a newly discovered 78 by Jaydee Short, the blues believer can use the calendar to jot down reminders of such upcoming occasions as April 22 (Buddy Guy at Massey Hall) and October

29 to November 5 (Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise).

Guitarist Presents BB King Tribute Edition - Unfortunately 2015 was the year we lost the guitarist Riley B. King. We knew him as B.B., and we knew him all of our lives. The British music magazine Guitarist issued a commemorative edition, packed with stories, testimonials and a lesson on how to play "The Thrill is Gone".

Fantastic Negrito An Honest Man (Blackball Universe) - Early this year the unknown Oakland musician Xavier Dphrepaulezz, trading under the name and alter ego persona of Fantastic Negrito, won an NPR Music contest. In doing so, he found an audience. On his EP, he does a raw and ravaged electric kind of earthy blues thing.

Neil Young Bluenote Café (Reprise) - He don't want no cash. He don't need no money He ain't even got no stash. In 1988, Neil Young went bluesy and gramatically double negative, touring in support of This Note's for

You with a horn-enhanced **Crazy Horse**. The shows were recorded; a live document now sees the light of day. For fans of a swinging kind of Neil, this album's for you.

Dave Alvin & Phil Alvin Lost Time Yep Roc – Last year's Common Ground offered up Big Bill Broonzy and made this list. This set of new songs covers a wider range and with equal talent & enthusiasm. May their reconciliation last forever.



Various Artists Muddy Waters 100 Raisin' Music - A worthy tribute for Muddy's centennary. John Primer and friends (Johnny Winter, Shemekia Copeland, **James Cotton** etc.) do Muddy proud with contemporary and traditional

versions of his classics.

Griel Marcus "Three Songs Three Singers Three Nations" Harvard Press - His long career as a music writer has culminated in a deep understanding of the folk tradition, making this slim volume a most intriguing read. "Last Kind Word Blues" by Geeshie Wiley is the second of the three and its status as a blues classic is brilliantly illustrated. Little



is known the genesis of this song or about Ms. Wiley, even with recent discoveries and Marcus's penchant for eminently plausible fiction serves him well.

Rhiannon Giddens Tomorrow Is My Turn Nonesuch – A solo disc from the Carolina Chocolate Drops singer moves her to the front ranks of blues women, as her version of "Last Kind Word Blues" proves.

Shemekia Copeland Outskirts of Love Alligator – The new Queen of the Blues strikes gold with this one, tremendous songs, wonderful players and what a voice. She wants to change the world too, it sounds like we should let her.

TBS Talent Search winner Michael Schatte performs at the TBS Hump Day Blues at the Jazz Bistro on Wednesday, December 2 and will be representing the Toronto Blues Society in the solo/duo category at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis January 26-30. A fundraiser to defray his travel costs will be taking place in January

Michael Schatte (pronounced SHAW-tee) probably wouldn't call himself a Bluesman. And yet since January, the Canadian guitarist, vocalist and songwriter has found himself a top-eight finalist at the 2015 Memphis International Blues Challenge, the winner of the 2015 Toronto Blues Society Talent Search, and by year's end he'll have hit the main stage on several major stops of the Canadian blues and jazz festival circuit.

Though he loves the blues (and evidently does it well), it's just one ingredient in the eclectic brew of original rock, blues, rockabilly, bluegrass, and celtic he's been writing, recording, and performing throughout his career. This blend of genres, often described as contemporary roots, is delivered with stunning impact on his new album, Turn Back the Vikings. Vikings confirms what fans of Michael's recorded catalogue and high-energy live shows have long known: this is a musician headed for widespread recognition.



The Way We Was Screening: On December 3 there will be a screening of Christopher Darton's documentary, The Way We Was: The Story of the Kendall Wall Band at the Lakeshore Catholic Performing Arts Centre in Port Colborne, Ontario. The film covers the 11 year career of the popular group starting at Toronto's Black Swan Tavern where their Saturday Afternoon Blues Matinee became legendary, and follows them as they develop as a band and expand their role as a backing band for many pre-eminent Canadian and American blues artists. The last part of the film documents the remixing, editing, mastering and revitalization of the band's "almost lost" 25 year-old studio recordings. 






Neil Young Bluenote Café Reprise

In 1988, during a period of experimentation with different genres of music, Neil Young released an album called This Note's For You, featuring Crazy Horse and a large horn section and some surprisingly bluesy songs. The album sold poorly and received poor reviews but he took the band on the road anyway and the latest release in his archive series is this two-disc set of recordings from that tour - playing the songs live has clearly made a world of difference. After a rather desultory 12 bar blues, "Welcome To The Big Room", we get a stunning "Don't Take Your Love Away From Me", with a "Thrill Is Gone" guitar intro and excellent lyrics well-delivered. Young's guitar solos go with a wonderful unison horn chorus and a solid sax solo. Even at nine and a half minutes you don't want it to end. My favourite from the original album was "Ten Men Working" and the live version is far better. The album title is the name he's given these ten men, not a place and they do work very hard. There's room for social commentary as well with "Life In The City" a powerful comment on how life there isn't good for everyone. Apparently written while still in high school, "Hello Lonely Woman" is another fine blues, with an uptempo Jimmy Reed feel. It sounds like Neil himself takes the harmonica solo. "Soul Of A Woman" is one of seven previously unreleased songs here, you'll find yourself wondering why it's taken 27 years for it to see the light of day. Another fine slow blues, "One Thing" is introduced as 'Does anyone here have trouble at home?' and a tender lyric about a coming breakup follows. "I'm Goin'" was a non-album B-side, the far better live version is taken from the CNE

show on the tour, it's a straight 12 bar with some punchy horns and a slide solo. There are several of these on the program, "Ain't It The Truth", Married Man", "Doghouse", songs with relatively minor (for Neil) lyrics on top of some amazingly robust structures, everyone is clearly having a good time, including the audience. Several non-blues songs will keep Young fans happy, including the atmospheric "Twilight" and a 20-minute version of "Tonight's The Night". Mr. Young's isn't the first name that comes up when talking about blues singers but you'll be impressed at this outing, I certainly was. At a budget price for two and a half hours of music, this might be the deal of the year.



Dione Taylor Born Free Matay

It's been too long between albums for this Regina-born, Toronto-based singer. Her first disc Open Your Eyes was nominated for a Juno in 2004. Since then she's been nominated for a Gemini Award for her performance of Oscar Peterson's "Hymn To Freedom" with Oliver Jones at the Canadian Songwriter's Gala (it's on YouTube) and toured with David Clayton Thomas, and of course her appearance with the Women's Blues Revue. For this new one, as the press release states, she's tackling some serious issues and decided on a rootsier sound, with Sean Pinchin featured prominently on slide quitar. For the opener we get "Love Is (beyond you and me)", it's her response to injustice everywhere including those done in the name of religion. With two guitars & handclaps, it's a stirring choice. A marvellous blues follows, about the end of love, "Leave Me Alone". A foot tapper on fighting temptation is another keeper: "Resist" has a catchy chorus over its martial drumbeat. Bill Withers' "Grandma's Hand" helps her deal with the death of her grandmother, a beautiful performance. Her own "Born Free" stresses her independence not just from another person but also to believe as she chooses. "Higher Ground" is the Stevie Wonder song, its message of achieving potential getting a pleading workout. A song of acceptance closes an all-too-short program: "Beer and A Bible" embraces the secular and the sacred in her life, the life of a preacher's daughter in the modern world. Jordan Officer Blue Skies Select

Montreal's Jordan Officer found the inspiration for I'm Free, his last album in New York. This time he moved his young family to Los Angeles for a month. The album grew into a journey through the music styles that got him to this point. The first song he sang & played publicly in high school was Tom Waits' "Blue Skies", it gets a bluesy treatment here. There are no Lonnie Johnson songs here and he's probably very tired of references to his sound being so influenced but the similarity is unmistakable. In his press release, Officer proudly announces his inclusion in Hal Leonard's sheet music books among the greats quoted in Scott Yanow's "The Great Jazz Guitarists, The Ultimate Guide", so enough of Mr. Johnson then, Officer's quitar work on this disc is superb throughout. The Big Three Trio's "Got You On My Mind" provides an especially good example of his guitar work. The tempo picks up for Arthur Alexander's "Shot of Rhythm And Blues" which features back up vocals from former partner Susie Arioli and another amazing solo that is faded all too early. His laid back vocal style is made to measure for Leroy Carr's "How Long Blues". Bob Dylan's "When The Deal Goes Down" (from Modern Times) also gets a nicely bluesy turn. "Takin' Off"features one more guest, Augie Meyers, who contributes some of his trademark Tex-Mex organ to an attractive instrumental to close. A lovely late night album from Mr. Officer and if you are so inclined a guitar player's textbook. He's placed himself in a long line of jazz guitar trios with blues and some pop tunes differentiating him nicely. His web site, www.jordanofficer.com, shows only Ouebec dates so far but he's no stranger to these parts. It lets you check out the songs too.



Les Copeland To Be In Your Company Earwig

Vernon, BC blues guitarist Les Copeland came to my attention with his earlier disc on Chicago's Earwig label. Owner Michael Frank is a hands-on kind of guy, he plays harp very well and takes a major interest in the careers of the blues men he signs. His most important artist for some years was the legendary Delta veteran David "Honeyboy" Edwards. On a Western tour with Honeyboy, Mr. Frank met Les Copeland who sat in and a 15-year friendship with both ensued. Honeyboy quested on the earlier one, 2010's Don't Let The Devil In and you may have caught the three of them at Hugh's Room during the subsequent tour. Honeyboy passed away at the age of 96 shortly after that tour and To Be In Your Company opens with a heartfelt tribute that lovingly details how Copeland and Honeyboy first met. A little further on, "Bessie" captures Copeland's last meeting with Honeyboy, Honeyboy had cashed in his air miles to bring Copeland to Chicago and Bessie was Honeyboy's loving wife. "Borderline" is a sarcastic acoustic slide piece about trying to convince the U.S. customs guys that he wasn't going to play without papers. He was indeed heading south to jam with Honeyboy. "Swamp Witch" is a more complex effort, a dark Jim Stafford story set in the Louisiana bayou country. That he has a wide repertoire ise shown with performances of Jelly Roll Morton's "Winin' Boy Blues", Gordon Lightfoot's "Ribbon Of Darkness", Bob Dylan's "Moonshiner" and The Kinks' "Sunny Afternoon" and he makes it all work. He saves a chunk of the program for songs about his family and partner Sari joins him for a couple. All in all, a something a little different for your listening pleasure. Reno Jack The Bear Lightning Fried Hwy 11

A veteran of Toronto's cow punk scene, Reno Jack has lately teamed up with Aitikokan's blues woman Sunday Wilde. Her blues influence is apparent on this recent disc, with various styles from his lengthy performing history coming out as a very pleasing blend. Reno Jack plays bass and has great, low voice, sometimes described as 'barbed wire wrapped in velvet'. The opening, title song, is a case in point with a fairly standard rockabilly tune turning into a blues-rock highlight with a solid harp break from none other than Watermelon Slim. The song tells the story of a tornado touching down. "Say Self" is a delightful Jimmy Reed style blues about changing his lifestyle that goes seamlessly country for the chorus. More harp from Slim too. "Salt" is a rocker on the evils of this particular additive with Slim on dobro. You might and perhaps should think twice before reaching for the shaker after hearing this one. Another highlight is "Slow Dancing", a song by Johnny Lovesin. It's a song from his time playing in that band. There's also a Handsome Ned tune from those days here as well. "Gee Oogle It Baby" shows he's up on modern times as he laments the internet's influence. Slim's back on harp. The brevity that twitter needs leads to some very clever rhymes in "All Atwitter". Ms. Wilde adds harmony vocals and piano where needed. There's a jazz piece and some folk & country tunes among the blues in a rather impressive debut CD that showcases a dry & witty songwriter. It's not hard to see that Watermelon Slim and Reno Jack would get along just fine. 'Born in the fifties, schooled in the sixties and a survivor of the seventies' and now his first album - maybe some things are meant to come later.
