Colin James and Women Sweep the Maple Blues Awards

Seven Women Take Trophies Home from Koerner Hall Gala

It was a hot time on a cold night at Koerner Hall in Toronto as some of the best in Canadian Blues were honoured with Maple Blues Awards at the near sold-out 22nd annual Maple Blues Awards

Vancouver's Colin James was the big winner at this year's Maple Blues Awards, taking home five awards for Entertainer of the Year, Electric Act of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year, Recording/Producer of the Year and Songwriter of the Year.

Female blues musicians were well represented in several of the other categories, with awards going to Sue Foley for Guitarist of the Year, Lindsay Beaver for Drummer of the Year, Laura Greenberg for Bassist of the Year, Shirley Jackson for Horn Player of the Year, Emily Burgess for New Artist of the Year and Angel Forrest for Female Vocalist of the Year.

Calgary based Ellen McIlwaine aka Goddess of the Slide, was honoured for her long career and outstanding contribution to the Canadian blues scene with the Blues with a Feeling Award (Lifetime Achievement Award).

The Blues Booster of the Year Award, another special Maple Blues Award, was

handed out to the Hornby Island Blues Society for their continued contribution the Canadian blues scene. The volunteer-driven organization hosts the Hornby Island Blues Week and Music Camp every May on beautiful Hornby Island, BC. Their mandate is to bring blues performers to the island to create a greater awareness of Canadian blues music and of the depth that Canadian musicians have to offer.

In addition to the 17 Maple Blues Awards handed out throughout the gala event, the winners of the 5th annual Cobalt Prize Contemporary Blues Composition Award were announced. The Cobalt Prize Contemporary Blues Composition Award was created and originally funded by Juno Award winner Paul Reddick, whose goal was to change the way audiences perceive and appreciate blues music. The intention behind the Cobalt Prize is to promote blues music through the exploration of its form. In 2020 the Maple Blues Awards will introduce the Sapphire Award for Best Blues Video.

Hosted by popular theatre/television actor and blues artist Raoul Bhaneja, the audience were treated to sizzling performances by Edmonton expat Jenie Thai, Newfoundland's Earle & Coffin, Ottawa's Sue Foley (now based in Austin), and New Artist of the Year, Salt Spring Island's Harry Manx teamed up with Monkey Junk's Steve Marriner to preview their new release and Raoul close the show with the Big Time joined by surprise guest and big winner Colin for the finale. February 3, 2020 will be the next date for the Maple Blues Awards at Koerner Hall. This year was the 10th edition of the awards gala at Koerner Hall."



Suzie Vinnick on Songwriting

For this edition of Notes & Quotes, the featured artist needs no introduction. She has been a fairly regular feature in this series, and rightfully so. Suzie Vinnick is an accomplished artist, and there are lots of points of interest. The last Notes & Quotes featured a discussion with Vinnick about the upcoming Women's Blues Revue, which took place last November at Roy Thomson Hall (as per expectation, the Women's Blues Revue was a resounding success). This time, the conversation that took place highlights Vinnick's offerings as a songwriter.

One of the things that accentuates Vinnick's credibility as a professional songwriter is that she has successfully penetrated the consumer's market by having her songs placed in other mediums. When asked to speak about that process, Vinnick offers this;

"Having your songs placed in television or commercials can be a full-time job! Pursuing music supervisors, knocking on doors, and developing relationships are a lot of work, but worth it. Finding someone to help place your songs in other forms of media is important. Sometimes you might be asked to write a song for a specific production too. These days it seems like a necessary extension of your catalogue from a standpoint of generating revenue."

Understanding that Vinnick has done songwriting collaborations on her most recent endeavors, the conversation naturally begged the question about the pros and cons of collaborating, specifically with respect to songwriting. Vinnick says;

"Collaborating for me, is mostly pros. Working with another songwriter helps to cultivate ideas. Music comes to me a lot more easily than the lyrics, so working with a collaborator helps me find and covey that "essence" of a song. I like writing solo for sure, but I also love collaborating. And, it can never hurt to bounce your ideas off of a trusted listener. Sometimes being your own critic, or separating yourself from your work, can be very hard."

Vinnick is also quick to offer a helpful word of advice to songwriters who are looking to take their writing to the next level: "Being open is important. There are some really good books and courses that can help add tools to your songwriting toolbox. Revisiting ideas and talking to people for new ideas and inspiration is also very helpful."



Suzie Vinnick has placed songs in TV and films and had many successful collaborations over her illustrious career. She will share her songwriting experiences and anecdotes at the TBS Songwriting Workshop taking place at Drom Taberna on Saturday March 9th from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00. Watch this space for more names of participants.

Based on that last quote, it is an appropriate time to mention this point of note: Vinnick will be hosting a Songwriting Workshop on March 9th. When asked what some of the things people can typically expect at one of her songwriting workshops, she says;

"For a workshop I do, I might start by talking about where a song starts and where it ends up. I'll talk about things like metaphors and the process of song development. One of the best songwriting workshops I've ever been to was largely centered around the concept that the news is all around you, it's just a matter of having your antennae up.

My workshops kind of follow that same idea that writers will focus on identifying and developing. There's a lot we go over, for sure."










Colin Linden & Luther Dickinson Amour Stony Plain/Warner

These two giants of roots music have generated something quite unique out of their regular get-togethers. This album has the telepathic collaboration of the two guitarists as its foundation but with guest vocalists and members of the cast of the TV series Nashville for which Linden is the music director, it is much more of a communal effort than the duet album we might think we're getting. This communal atmosphere is of course one reason Nashville is such a magnet for performers. We get under way with a quite different instrumental version of "Careless Love" with Colin on electric dobro and Luther on electric slide guitar plus bass & percussion. The tempo picks up dramatically with "Don't Let Go", an R&B hit for Roy Hamilton in 1958. Colin takes the lead vocal with Rachael Davis & Ruby Amanfu trading lines. With Colin's instantly recognizable electric slide, you can check this one out early on YouTube. Jimmy Reed's "Honest I Do' features Ms. Davis on lead vocal with the two electric guitars, one of which uses the tremolo setting to emulate Jimmy's harp. A more acoustic and more familiar version of "Careless Love" again has Ms. Davis on vocals and Luther on nylon string guitar. The backing band is called collectively The Tennessee Valentines and this song features Kevin McKendree on organ and Fred Kaplin on fiddle. Bryan Owings is at the drum kit and Dominic Davis plays bass. Attractive versions of country classics "Crazy Arms" and "For the Good

Times" lead into a rock 'n' roll classic "Lover Come Back" sung by its writer, the legendary Billy Swan. Ms. Davis sings harmony and Kaplin plays accordion for a most delightful performance. Ruby Amanfu sings lead on the R&B hit for Chuck Willis in 1958, "What Am I Living For" - she has a remarkable voice, one I'll surely keep track of. Colin solos most effectively on vocals for Bo Diddley's "Dearest Darling" with just the two guitars this time, Colin on dobro. These are songs we all grew up with and that's probably as good a definition of Americana as any. Sit back and enjoy them in these new settings as much as these players obviously did. Michael Jerome Browne That's Where It's At Borealis

The combination of Michael Jerome Browne's voice and his guitar has always been something very special. To use that combination to give us an intimate look at soul music from a traditional blues player's perspective is a master stroke. His deep knowledge of early recordings is put to good use as we get Blind Willie Johnson's street gospel song "Everybody Ought to Treat a Stranger Right", a duet with Eric Bibb. "Pharoah", a spiritual by Mrs. Sidney Carter was recorded by Alan Lomax in 1959 but it no doubt goes back much further and here MJB is joined by Harrison Kennedy - the result is sheer pleasure. Taking us into the sixties, Lowell Fulson's hit "Black Nights" gets a stirring solo performance joining Bobby 'Blue' Bland's "That's the Way Love Is" a second duet with Harrison. Sam Cooke's "Somebody Have Mercy" moves from blues/R&B/soul firmly into soul. Al Green's "Here I Am (Come and Take Me)" and Randy Newman's "Louisiana 1927" are well-chosen classics from the '70's. Stevie Wonder's "Skeletons", from Characters, is startlingly relevant some thirty years

after it was written, something made very clear in MJB's remarkable performance. We also get some new songs from MJB and his partner B.A. Markus that clearly hold their own in this company. "Love's A Funny Thing", "Remember When" and "Where is the Song?" bring us into the current period. The first two are gorgeous love songs and the third an attractive song of love lost. "Remember When" is a duet with Roxanne Potvin, another highlight for sure. I've put the songs into their historical order but MJB shuffles them, giving you a glimpse of how timeless and seamless this music is. The order also includes a couple of memorable MJB guitar instrumentals. MJB's trademark gourd banjo, a replica of the kind played in the late 1800's, is featured on a reprise of "Pharoah" that concludes the program. John McColgan, a bandmate from MJB's days in the Stephen Barry Band, provides drums on five of the songs to great effect. The booklet includes lyrics and his usual 'Guitar Nerd's Corner'. Michael Jerome Browne, with guest Harrison Kennedy, will host the CD release party for us at Hugh's Room on Feb. 22.



Ragtime Orioles Ragtime Orioles Blind Resignation

You may not have known that a renowned expert in early blues and ragtime is right here in town: Professor Emeritus Bill Westcott retired from teaching music at York U. in 2010. He has a couple of solo CDs featuring his piano playing and has now assembled a group to play some of these songs in a more formal setting. Brenna MacCrimmon is on voice & percussion; Andrew Downing, bass; Tim Posgate, banjo and Chris Robinson on clarinet. In these performances, they take us back in time to a period when blues and jazz were emerging from ragtime and into vaudeville. This may be the first

time such a comprehensive survey has been undertaken of this exciting period in music history. Before recordings got under way, much of this music was available only as sheet music and Westcott in his booklet notes gives us valuable information you probably won't find anywhere else. The album title, and the group name, comes from "Ragtime Oriole", a 1911 composition that shows the transition. The first bluesman was reputed to be Butler May aka Stringbeans, who died young in 1917 before he could record but he apparently came up with many of the blues piano licks that we all know. He isn't included here but there are many others who are. Westcott spent quite a lot of time with blues piano legend Eurreal "Little Brother" Montgomery, whose own teacher was there in the early 1900's and "Martin/Anderson Blues" is Westcott's medley of two tunes remembered by Little Brother. Bessie Smith was so popular that she could tap the best songwriters and four songs here were made famous by her: "Mama's Got the Blues" and "I Need A Little Sugar in My Bowl," both co-written by Clarence Williams in 1923, are among the first appearances of 'blue notes' in popular music. Her "Careless Love Blues" is used as an example of an updated pre-blues ballad. Jelly Roll Morton, Merline Johnson and Sidney Bechet are all featured here as well. Ragtime Orioles is an all-star gathering, MacCrimmon has sung with Westcott often but is also involved in theatre and is worldfamous as a singer of Turkish folk songs, bassist Downing is a founding member of the Art of Time Ensemble, Posqate is a jazz banjo ace with several CDs and Robinson is a master of New Orleans saxophone & clarinet with the Swing City band. They play this music very well indeed. The CD art is a 1908 map of New Orleans and the notes include a comprehensive reading list. Mike Goudreau Alternate Takes, Vol 1 PMG

This Eastern Townships veteran has quite a large discography both solo or as leader of the **Boppin' Blues Band**. Not as well-known is his sideline as a composer of music for films and TV. He now has a CD of highlights from that work and it comes as something of a surprise that songs of this quality have been 'hidden' this way. Vol. 1 covers the blues selections from a catalogue of some fifty songs and these are actual songs as opposed to instrumental interludes. We get a storming, horn-led

opener in "Can't Take It No More" and a little later "You Can't Keep A Good Man Down" with its toe-tapping groove. "The Grass Ain't Greener" keeps that horn band cooking. A fine slow blues, "Come Back Home" has just piano and guitar and that's all it needs. A catchy melody and a very nice lyric make "Happy Birthday Blues" a highlight too. He still misses her. Special mention to **Steve Soucy** on piano



on these last two. **Rob Rio** takes over the piano stool for the boogie woogie-styled "She's in the Pocket". Goudreau covers other bases here too, with some jazz, reggae and even Manouche Swing. As a further measure of his versatility, "Come Back Home" is re-worked as a **Bo Diddley** rocker to conclude. The web site for this prolific singer/songwriter/guitarist is www.mikegoudreau.com.

Watermelon Slim Church of the Blues NorthernBlues


William Homans, aka Watermelon Slim, recorded Golden Boy last year in Winnipeg and released it on France's Dixiefrog label. This new one has him once again on our NorthernBlues. A longtime resident of Clarksdale MS. Church of the Blues was apparently recorded back in his hometown of Norman, Oklahoma and what we get is his trio with lots of guests, primarily on lead quitar. Howlin' Wolf once said that he rarely played guitar because he felt his style was too old fashioned, he had Hubert Sumlin there to provide that more contemporary sound. Perhaps the same thinking is at work here. We do get a program of mostly modern blues songs plus some newly-arranged older ones. We start off with a remarkable new song by one Ron L. Meadors that is the first single: "St. Peter's Ledger" is a barnburner of a song about being deeply in debt but hoping that his credit is still good at the Pearly Gate. Bob Margolin contributes some amazing slide guitar. A new version of Muddy's "Gypsy Woman" is another highlight, with Margolin an obvious choice on guitar and he does not disappoint. "Post-Modern Blues" is a Slim original, a fine song lamenting his inability to stay up to date with technology with Nick Schnebelen questing on lead guitar. A guite wonderful rendering of Allen Toussaint's "Get Out of My Life Woman" features Sherman Holmes and John Németh, an all-star vocal trio if there ever was one. Another original is "Mni Wiconi - The Water Song" extending his very much up to date concerns about water usage along with his awareness of Indigenous traditions, Joe Louis Walker quests here. Wolf's "Smokestack Lightning" gets a total makeover. "That Ole 1-4-5" is a




delightful Slim original about the durability of traditional blues, a theme he picks up with Fred McDowell's "61 Highway Blues". McDowell may not recognize it but it is a matchless traditional performance and it didn't need a guest guitarist. Slim didn't even need his band for "Holler #4", an a capella field holler dealing with some very contemporary issues - these hollers are a feature of his live sets and this one is another masterpiece. He's up to date on his politics as well as his "Charlottesville (Blues for a Nation)" shows. Németh duets here and it's a major highlight. John Allouise is on bass and Brian Wells on drums, there are keyboards and for the first time, a horn section - all of which makes for one of the best modern blues albums so far in this young year - Watermelon Slim continues to be a force to be reckoned with. Kudos to Michael Wrycraft for making Slim look so dapper in his best church-going clothes. His web site is www.watermelonslim.com and it shows no Canadian dates yet but his management says they're working on it, he loves playing here.


