



Morgan Davis A Lifelong Student of the Blues

"Anything I want to say I can say with the Blues." - Morgan Davis

Originally from Detroit, Michigan Morgan Davis grew up listening to a rich diversity of music; everything from rock and roll to Motown. In 1962 his family relocated to California where he discovered artists like Blind Lemon Jefferson, The Doors and Electric Flag. He started playing guitar at 16.

After graduating from high school, he became involved in the anti-Vietnam movement and to avoid being drafted, moved to Canada. He arrived in Toronto in 1968. The "times were a changing", especially musically. There was a resurgence of interest in the Blues. American Blues musicians embraced this young, new, attentive audience by often coming to Toronto to play. There were at least 40 clubs & coffee houses in the area that had live music every night. According to Davis, his musical career started when he moved into Rochdale College in Yorkville, then a mecca for artists. He says he paid \$14/month for a closet there. Then, Toronto Star described Yorkville as a place where there was "an explosion of youthful literary & musical talent who were appearing on small stages in smokey coffee houses next to edgy art galleries & funky fashion boutiques."This environment gave him ample opportunity to meet, listen & jam with some of the best Blues artists of the time, from John Hammond to Son House to Muddy Waters & Junior Wells. He joined a local band called "The Rhythm Rockets" & soon after, started his own Blues band called "The Knights of the Mystic Sea." His first big gig was in the upstairs room at the legendary "El Mocambo" in 1974. He began to tour. Eventually travelling across Canada, the U.S. and Europe. He would play hundreds of shows in any given year. He honed his art & developed his own style. This style reflected a deep understanding of the Blues. He tapped into Delta, Texas & Chicago Blues but also paid homage to traditional & country blues. Over his 5-decade career he has opened for and performed with the likes of Albert King, Muddy Waters and Sunnyland Slim, just to name a few. In 1984, one of the highlights of his life was the week he and his band backed up the legendary Hubert Sumlin at Toronto's Pine Tree Tavern. Sumlin, lead guitarist for Howlin' Wolf is still revered by Morgan.

In those days, Davis says, you would play six-nights from Monday to Saturday, and a Saturday matinee.

His lifetime of music has garnered him accolades that run long and deep. He has received multiple Maple Blues Awards including "Song Writer of the Year" "Male Vocalist of the Year" and "Producer of the Year". In 1988 Colin James's smoking version of Morgan's song, "Why'd You Lie" was a hit for Colin James and featured on his self-titled debut album. In 2004, Morgan won a Juno award for "Blues album of the year" for his release, *Painkiller*.

For the last 20 years he has made his home in Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. But nothing, other than Covid, has stopped him from touring, not even after 50 years! In some ways, his life of playing blues has meant he has had to swim upstream, away from the trends of the day-and by extension, broader success. "Blues guys rarely get rich & famous". He says this without bitterness. "I consider myself incredibly lucky & successful at what I do: I manage to make my living playing music & I've always been able to play the music I love." Davis rarely has time to ask, "what If?" as he is too busy touring & recording. There have been times over

the decades though that he has had to gain attention by whatever means necessary. To drum up attendance one year at a New Year's Eve show in New Orleans, he made a meal of red beans & rice. "I made red beans & rice for 80 people for that gig: somehow, I heated & served them all up and played 3 sets."Today, his soulful guitar playing and his distinctive vocal style still resonate with audiences and critics alike. On stage Davis carves out a space between entertainer, music professor and skilled master of his craft. His sense of fun coupled with his love of the blues & great song writing is what makes Davis a blues legend today. Although he is uncomfortable with that label. "I know who the legends are; I'm just a lifelong Student of the Blues"

His 2023 tour started in Halifax, and he has been playing to clubs throughout all of Ontario since May. He is at the Paisley Blues Festival on June 2nd, Castro's in Toronto on June 11th, the R.C.H.A. club in Kingston on June 15th, and The Cove in Westport on June 22nd. A Story of Music, Love and the Blues

The Toronto Blues Society has just completed a strategic planning process where board members and members of the Musicians Advisory Committee have been getting together to discuss the organization's identity and help shape the path forward. It seems like a good time to look at how other blues societies operate and TBS member Lynn Boucher has offered to give us a little history on the Kingston Blues Society. We hope in future editions we can tell the stories of all the great blues societies who are keeping the blues alive in Canada.

The Kingston Blues Society officially became a nonprofit in 2006 but its origins go back much further. It evolved from a friendship of two Kingston, Ont. couples who shared the same passion- a love of live music. Pamela and Bruce Boucher/Susan and Frank Warnica first met when their daughters attended the same elementary school. This social connection opened the door to a deep friendship based on a shared love of the Blues. The foursome started to go to live music all over Ontario and beyond.

One night Bruce and Frank were standing in line to see Johnny Winter in Kingston when Frank said how much better it would be if they could see similar shows at home. "If only there was a way to book the bands ourselves" he mused. Bruce replied "Hey, I can book the bands". Bruce had booked live music all through high school, and not just local bands: artists like Murray Mclauglin and Mike and Suzie Quatro. They forged a plan with their loving wives to bring local, national and international Blues artists to Kingston. They had full time jobs and families to raise but they were ready to take this on.

They were the ideal composite to make this lofty goal work; Pamela had bookkeeping skills; Susan had management and banking: Frank and

Bruce would book the shows and take care of everything else. They formed the Kingston Blues Society. Jack de Keyzer offered to do their first show. Frank recalls that they were so concerned about getting the word out, they plastered posters on their back car windows and drove around town! They had no need to worry. The show sold out and was a huge success! Their love of Blues had started them on their journey.

They agreed that paying the bands would be their first priority and that they would never take a penny for themselves. They wanted to begin with a Blues Jam night. They approached every live music club in Kingston only to be rejected. Finally, the R.C.H.A.Club (the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery) tentatively agreed.

"Blues Societies are the life blood that helps keep the Blues alive and thriving. I have been fortunate to play every year for the Kingston Blues Society since it began in 2006, including playing their very first show. It has been an honor and a privilege to work with such a wonderful group of blues loving people." Jack de Keyzer

> This historic building was already a nonprofit and on the downtown waterfront. And it came with a bar and a good sound system. They held their first Blues Jam there hosted by local teenagers "Mojo Shooter". That continued for 8 years. Their bigger ticket shows continued too, but over time they realized that these larger venues were only sustainable on an occasional basis.

> They decided to focus on the RCHA club as the right venue for their membership to grow. The venue is small-it only holds 80 people-but they believed that the intimate nature of the club would attract the approval of musicians and audiences alike. Since then, KBS Blues shows have become the backbone of the RCHA Club. Many blues artists from across Canada have played here. Most musicians love the intimacy of the place! They have also attracted bands from around the world like Wellbad from Germany and Black Diamond Express from Scotland, and for some of their shows in larger halls: Johnny Winter, Big Bill Morganfield and Coco Montoya from the U.S., just to name a few.

There have been many highlights and few missteps. One highlight for Bruce was at the RCHA Club when Victor Wainright decided to set up his piano in the middle of the room asking the crowd to form a circle around him. A Tour de Force in a kitchen party setting! He was a sensation!

For Susan, the most precious of nights was at their 15th Anniversary Show. Pamela's health was failing but she was determined to go. Jack de Keyzer was performing as he was their first KBS artist. Susan mentioned Pam to Jack and he asked if there was a song he might play for her. Pam and Susan shared a love of Stevie Wonder's "Superstition." It was not a blues song nor a usual one in his repertoire. He said very little about her suggestion and Susan forgot about it. Pam arrived at the club in her wheelchair

> with her children beside her. Jack not only opened the set with "Superstition" but left the stage with some of the band, surrounding Pam and Susan to give them a personal performance. Amidst the hugs; love, tears and the Blues flowed.

> In seventeen years, the remaining three founding members have never lost their passion for the Blues. They feel good about helping to bring quality musicianship to an intimate local club for highly enthusiastic audiences. They believe that they have met their mandate of supporting young and local talent. If there have been any surprises,

it's not only the longevity of their friendship but also how many new friendships have been forged between Blues Society members. It has helped to create a community unlike any other. A community inspired by live music and supported by a local society rich with love for the Blues.

KBS continues to bring high-caliber live music to their hometown.

Tony Holiday Motel Mississippi Forty Below

With a cohort of like-minded musicians, vocalist and harmonica player Tony Holiday has been shaking up the blues scene in Memphis since his move there from Salt Lake City in 2017. In Motel Mississippi, his

second solo album, he called on quitarists A.J. Fullerton (who had a hand in writing all the original material) and Dave Gross to co-produce the CD, which was recorded in Mississippi. Paired with his skilfulness on the harp, Holiday's vocals have a mellow, retro touch, gliding across the lyrics with finesse. All but two tracks are originals; each song is influenced by such styles as Delta blues, Memphis soul, Hill Country blues and Cajun music.

The first track, "Rob & Steal," written by Mississippi bluesman Paul "Wine" Jones, is a swampy, hypnotic number that highlights Holiday's resonant vocals, while the heaviness of the rhythm, saturated with organ, contrasts with a delicate guitar solo dancing above. His command of the harmonica is evident in "Get By," a buoyant song reverberating with impassioned harp countered by guitar. "Trouble," cowritten by Holiday, also includes rousing harp and guitar, with Victor Wainwright adding a dash of wah-wah on the clavinet. Then "She's So Cold" is somewhat trancelike, as Holiday sings of a woman who's uninterested in their relationship while he remains enticed.

Jake Friel takes up the harmonica in the lively "Just As Gone" in an effective call and response to Holiday's silken vocals, accentuated with tasteful slide guitar. His voice is at its best in "Nobody But You," written by Delta singer and guitarist Asie Payton. The smooth, laid-back quality of Holiday's vocals continues in "You Know Who I Am," emphasized by slide-guitar embellishments. Then in "Yazoo River," an unexpected but splendid conclusion co-written by Holiday, he and Friel face off in an instrumental Cajun-spiced harmonica duel. The rich interplay of their harps is an exquisite musical conversation, leaving the listener yearning for more.

In Motel Mississippi, Tony Holiday showcases the appealing fluidity and ease of his vocals, offset by a dynamic performance on the harmonica. With a nod to the past, he gives us hope in a solid future for the blues.




