

Why the Blues **Are Divine!**

The Blues has had a profound influence on the development of early Rhythm & Blues, Soul Music, and naturally, the modern Hip-Hop sound of today. Blues music and early R&B often overlapped. The influence of Blues on R&B can be heard in the instrumentation, lyrics & even chord progression & storytelling. But it is in the emotional expression of the voice where it often deeply connects. Calling that connection Soul, is an apt label.

Divine Brown is one of Canada's most successful and accomplished R&B soul singers. Although that alone does not do her justice. When considering her vocal abilities, she doesn't talk about her 5-octave range but rather the honesty of her voice. "If a voice could be honest, I think my voice is honest and raw". She says her love of music began at birth. Born in Toronto but of Jamaican descent she remembers her mom taking her to visit Jamaica when she was very young and into a retail hub where there was a jukebox. She begged her mom for change so she could play her favourite song over and over. When the change ran out, she would charm the owner into letting her continue to play the jukebox. Even at this early age, she knew music was what she wanted to hear and what she wanted to do.

From her very first album Divine Brown, released in 2005, she has written her own songs. It is a process she loves. Her original single from her first album, called "Old Skool Love" was an immediate hit and to this day is considered an R&B classic. And, like all great songs, it continues to be covered by a multitude of artists. In 2006, she was nominated for two Juno awards, "R&B Soul Recording of the Year" and "Best New Artist". In 2008 she released her second album to huge critical and popular success. The Love Chronicles garnered her first Juno award for "R&B Recording of the Year."

This was only the beginning for Miss Brown as she has gone on to have an artistically creative multi-faceted career. During the peak of their success, she toured with the Back Street Boys. She performed with artists as diverse as Gowan and collaborated in the studio with Nelly Furtado. She sang the greatest hits of Aretha Franklin for the Classic Live Album series. She joined fellow R&B singer Sean Jones for his Holiday Soul

Stage performance has nurtured her talent from the time she was 12 when she first appeared in Rainbow World written by Salome Bey. She sang in major musicals such as Rent

and Ain't Misbehavin'. In 2016 she played the "Woman" to his "Man" in Life, Death and the Blues penned by fellow actor/musician Raoul Bhaneja (Raoul & the Big Time) which explored the history of Blues. Her spectacular rendition of the gospel song "Take My Hand Precious Lord" brought the house down!

Recently she received the great honour of a music residency at Toronto's Soulpepper Theatre. With artistic director Mike Ross they created and staged Golden Record about the music launched into Space in 1977. Early this year, she wrote, produced and performed in Billie, Sarah and Ella: Revolutionary Women in Jazz, a live, documentary-style concert. Divine Brown not only presents the story of these three female pioneers but channels the essence of their music to the stage. Divine's deep love of jazz and vocal talent could have easily had her sing all three artists, but she chose Billie because she considered her the most challenging of the three. "I chose Billie because her tone is nothing like mine. There was an energy that Billie brought to each of her songs that was incredibly unique."

If there is one thing Divine Brown loves, it is a challenge. She loves theatre and intends to continue to challenge herself with new projects. She loves to sing live and enjoys sparking a reaction from an audience. "If people aren't reacting, I've got to dig deeper". In 2022 she released a new single "Digital Love" featuring Fingazz to critical and popular enthusiasm.

Divine Brown is honoured to be added to the stellar lineup of this year's 36th edition of the Women's Blues Revue. Some would arque that having a revered R&B artist like Miss Brown at a Blues concert is an appropriation, not the authentic thing. It is possible that there is no resolve as to what Blues is and who it belongs to. One could argue that it is primarily a form of secular folk music created

by African Americans. One could say it is a label created by music promoters. One could say the Blues is only about Oppression and Hard Times. Or that it only began when a guitar became electrified. One could say it is about all those things and more. One could even say it's Divine!

Find out for yourselves by coming out to hear just how Divine blues can be. The line-up of female artists this year is, to quote Ruthie Foster, "phenomenal" * Get your tickets soon though. It will sell out fast.

If you haven't yet been to the newly renovated Massey Hall, I cannot think of a better reason than the Women's Blues Revue scheduled for November 17th, 2023. The headliners include Dawn Tyler Watson, Laura Hubert, Sandra Bouza, Garnetta Cromwell, Charlotte McAfee-Brunner as well as Divine Brown with more to be announced. Tickets will include an after-performance party in the downstairs bar.

The Toronto Blues Society has recently completed a strategic planning process where board members and members of the Musicians Advisory Committee have been getting together to discuss the organization's identity and help shape the path forward. It seems like a good time to look at how other blues societies operate and in this issue, Thunder Bay Blues Society president Rob Croves passed along a quick recap on what's going on with our northern neighbours.

The Thunder Bay Blues Society is currently celebrating its 25th Anniversary (1998-2023) by hosting four events in 2023. The celebration year kicked off Saturday March 25 with Blues House Party 4. This sold out event featured local blues bands Voodoo Blue, The Blue Pretenders, James Boraski & Momentary Evolution and The B5 Blues Band. The evening culminated in a night ending jam with various special guests.

Next up Saturday May 27 was the sold out Blues Blast 2023. This multi-artist event showcased 2 locals acts (Brother John and The Chain) before Memphis-based artist Tony Holiday (supported by MonkeyJunk rhythm section of Steve Marriner and Matt Sobb) and Chicago based bands Dave Weld & The Imperial Flames and Mississippi Heat hit the stage.

The "Highway 61 to Memphis" Blues Challenge was held the afternoon of Saturday June 17 to a standing room only crowd. Five bands competed to represent the Thunder Bay Blues Society at the upcoming International Blues Challenge in Memphis January 16-20, 2024. The all-female trio The Bustle came out on top.

The last event of 2023 will be our inaugural Blues Shakedown on Saturday October 21. will features Shawn Holt, Toronzo Cannon and local Blues Challenge winners The Bustle.

2023 has been a very successful year with sold out shows and growing our blues society membership back to pre-covid numbers (over 300 members). We are looking forward to and already planning four events in 2024!

Label News: U.S.-based private equity firm Round Hill Music LP has announced its acquisition of Linus Entertainment and the recording and publishing catalogues of Borealis Records, Stony Plain Records, Mummy Dust Music Ltd, Solid Gold Records, The Children's Group, and True North Records as well as the distribution company Independent Digital Licensing Agency Inc (IDLA). Linus founder Geoff Kulawick will maintain all operations of the Ontariobased company and continue with his staff of 10 employees. Serving as an indie record label, distributor and music publisher, Linus Entertainment's artists include Big Wreck, whose 1997 debut album achieved double platinum certification, Canadian Hall of Fame inductee Bruce Cockburn, BAFTA, Golden Globe, and Academy Award winner Buffy Sainte-Marie, blues rocker Colin James, Gordon Lightfoot, Natalie MacMaster, Ronnie Earl and the Broadcasters, folk musician Stan Rogers, and Grammy-winning blues musician Taj Mahal. Its more recent roster of acts includes albums by songwriter Marc Jordan, fiddler Natalie MacMaster, celebrated Canadian folk singer Lynn Miles, and Canadian blues and country artist Crystal Shawanda. Round Hill's extensive and lucrative song catalogues assets also include other works by such notable Canadians as Triumph, Eddie Schwartz, Shawn Hook, Bruce Cockburn, and Jim Vallance, who had a long string of hits co-writing with Bryan Adams in the late '70s through 1989.

Bob Dylan Center Songwriter Fellowship: The Bob Dylan Center and Universal Music Publishing Group have introduced the very first Bob Dylan Center Songwriter Fellowship. The prestigious accolade is set to honour two distinct songwriters every year, providing them with a \$40,000 project stipend, exclusive presentation platforms, access to the invaluable Bob Dylan Archive, and the opportunity for recording sessions at the historic Church Studio in Tulsa, Okla., previously owned by Leon Russell. Aspiring songwriters can submit their entries until the deadline on Oct. 18. Eligibility criteria require applicants to be at least 18 years of age without a current publishing deal. 



The Blackburn Brothers -SoulFunkn'BLUES (Electro-Fi Records)

The Toronto music scene has been enriched by members of the Blackburn family for over five decades, beginning with veteran R&B artist and family patriarch Bobby Dean Blackburn. He has passed the torch onto a younger generation, and it is now burning bright in the form of The Blackburn Brothers, comprised of his sons Duane (lead vocals, organ, piano), Brooke (guitar, vocals), Cory (drums, harmony vocals), and Robert (guitar, harmony vocals).

The group won a Maple Blues Award in 2010 as New Artist/Group of the Year in 2010, and earned a Juno nomination in 2016 for Brothers In This World (under the band name Blackburn), and they have now pooled their considerable talents on a third and long-awaited album, SoulFunkn'BLUES.

The album was produced and mastered by Howard Ayee, with Cory Blackburn recording, mixing and engineering.

The sound of the Blackburn Brothers has never been confined by one genre category, as the title of this new record correctly notes. In a label press release, Duane Blackburn states that "this CD has more of a crossover blues rock feel with a funk foundation. It has a crossover sound without losing the original solid Blackburn Brothers feel /groove."

SoulFunkn'BLUES kicks off in righteous fashion with "Bobby's Blues," an apparent tribute to the family's head ("I did it my way," runs one lyric). It features sizzling lead guitar, lusty horns (from Neil Braithwaite and Neil Brathwaite and Ted Peters), and fluent piano.

It is followed by a mid-tempo soul/blues tune, "She's A Heartbreaker," one with a Robert Cray vibe (never a bad thing), then


an uptempo track, "Let The Devil Play," one enlivened by a sizzling guitar solo.

Subsequent tracks feature enough stylistic diversity to keep things interesting. Brooke Blackburn contributed six songs, and Robert four, with the one cover being a spirited take on the Neville Brothers' classic "Sister Rosa." It is fitting both for one musical tribe to cover a classic from another famed family and for it to be a song with a potent message of black pride.

A similar theme is explored in another album highlight, "Freedom Train," which urges "take a stand against the system," and features massed backing vocals.

Things slow down and get more personal on soul ballads "Why Do I Do (What I Do?, "Be My Wife," and closing cut "I Don't Ever Want To Be Alone," all showcasing Duane Blackburn's virile voice.

This is a consistently strong collection of songs, and let's hope we don't have to wait so long for the next Blackburn Brothers album. (Kerry Doole)



Coco Montoya Writing on the Wall **Alligator Records**

Coco Montova hits a home run in his 11th album, Writing on the Wall. This southpaw guitar master, who began as a drummer, is an alumnus of both Albert Collins's and John Mayall's bands. Montoya describes his philosophy as "Just play what you feel, be real about it, and enjoy yourself. That's what Albert Collins taught me."

For this outing — which he considers one of his best - he co-wrote five tracks and recorded with his touring band, comprising Jeff Paris (keyboards and guitar), Nathan Brown (bass) and Rena Beavers (drums).

Like a detonation, Writing on the Wall ignites with "I Was Wrong," a song of deep remorse. Montoya's vocals are rough-edged; he comes in with a wail. His exquisite quitar is a flawless complement, packing a colossal emotive punch. "Save It for the Next Fool" is a captivating number, animated with the the crystalline sound of his guitar. In the spirited rocker "You Got Me (Where You Want Me)," Montoya puts his own spin on this Bobby "Blue" Bland cover. With guest Ronnie Baker Brooks, the duo's white-hot guitar duel is spinetingling. Then "(I'd Rather Feel) Bad About Doin' It" endorses the credo that it's better to have regrets after an event than to not experience it at all. Montoya extends his best wishes to a former love in "Be Good to Yourself." His quitar speaks to us as it impeccably enhances his vocals, like an exclamation point.

"Stop," a Lonnie Mack number, is a stunner, both for Montoya's passionate voice and scorching guitar. Each time he bursts in with his instrument, Montova builds the song to a crescendo of intensity. His guitar solos here are transcendent, not to be missed. Jeff Paris's piano brings a different flavour to "Writing on the Wall," then he contributes a rousing guitar part to this upbeat rocker. In "Late Last Night," Montoya sings of a musician belligerently excusing himself for bad behaviour, then his voice becomes silky as he gets mellow with "What Did I Say?" His lustrous guitar seduces the listener, perfectly accentuating the heartfelt lyrics. In "A Chip and a Chair," we're treated to guest Lee Roy Parnell's ravishing slide. Accompanying Montoya's snarling vocals, the two guitars smoke in this life lesson from a grandfather.

Ronnie Baker Brooks is back for "Baby, You're a Drag," a mirthful conversation in song that's a joy in itself, but add their eloquent, searing guitar solos and it's a special gift. "The Three Kings and Me" is a contemplative Christmas number about spending the holidays alone, listening to Freddie, Albert and B.B. In it, Montoya's tender yet stirring vocals are punctuated by nuggets of superb guitar reminiscent of B.B. Montoya's voice assumes a tinge of toughness with the album closer, "Natural Born Love Machine." His guitar here is as intoxicating as the irresistible woman he's singing about.

Writing on the Wall is a tour de force of vocal versatility and guitar prowess. Whether delivered with grit or polish, Coco Montoya's voice articulates the sentiment of every song. Ramping up the impact of the lyrics, his guitar fills exhilarate as they emphasize the message. And highlighting each number, his quitar solos are sublime, striking viscerally at one's emotional core. (Sandra B. Tooze)


