Angelique Francis

At 25 years old, Angelique's bio is that of an artist twice her age. She first appeared on stage when she was seven years old in her hometown and the capital of Canada; Ottawa, Ontario. It was a big televised event of the opening of her public school and a defining moment." I realized from that performance that music was something I wanted to pursue." At thirteen, she made her first American appearance on the Oprah network; she had written and produced a theme song for the Gayle King show. "Since I was always composing, even at a young age, I decided to take a chance and send in a theme song to her. They loved it so much they ended up airing it on the show." At thirteen she began to perform at concerts across North America opening or sharing the stage with major artists like Buddy Guy, Gary Clark Jr., Beth Hart, Joe Bonamassa, Eric Gales, Trooper, Keb Mo, Shemekia Copeland and many more.

Her parents supported her pursuit of music as a career but also instilled in her the importance of education. In 2019, she graduated at the top of her class in the music program at Ottawa's Carlton University. She honed her craft, first learning to play the piano and then becoming a multi-instrumentalist. She often favors the standup bass and harmonica, but is also proficient on electric and acoustic guitar, electric bass, keys and more. A naturally gifted singer, she formed a band. But this was no ordinary band.

In the history of early Blues, family bands were quite common, especially in places like New Orleans. Following this tradition, Angelique reached out to her exceptional musical family. In their home a music jam almost always followed dinner. Her father played drums and produced music. Her three younger sisters all brought natural talent to the table. The very youngest sister, Kayla, sang on the band's latest album and it would surprise no one if she eventually found her way to the stage. Today Angelique performs with her two sisters; Kharincia on saxophones (alto, tenor and baritone) and Kira on trombone and keyboards. Their father, Kiran, provides ground under their feet as their drummer. All sing vocal harmony. The fine talents of trumpeter Ed Lister and guitarist Dave Williamson round out the line-up.

The impact of the Angelique Francis Band on an audience is profound. Her music respects yesterday and yet is original, diverse, powerful & dramatic. I asked her why the Blues? Her talent qualifies her for any

genre. "For me, the Blues is like a universal music language that has the strongest connection with all other forms of modern North American music. Blues is at the root of it all." Her 2018 debut album "Kissed by the Blues" is a testament to this. Written & produced with her dad in their studio, it embraces Blues from every genre related angle. It started her on her career as one of Canada's top Blues artists. To her fans who have followed her from the start, this was no surprise. "I grew up on stage, and music was something that really helped me to be me".

Presently, Angelique is on tour with her band. "People always ask me if I miss home, but I tell them that home is always with me. We love making music together. It's wonderful to be able to pursue a professional career, go on the road, doing what you love with those you love."

Angelique's accolades run long and deep. She has twice hosted and performed at Canada's Maple Blues Awards, receiving four of its nominations and winning Best Bass Player and New Blues Artist in 2023. This year her most recent album, "Long River" was honored with a JUNO; Canada's most prestigious award, for "Best Blues Album of the Year". It also garnered her 2023 nominations for the Blues Blast Awards, Canadian Folk Music Awards and Ontario Folk Music Awards.

"Long River" is a remarkable 14 track collection of original songs. The album's title track refers to the metaphorical river of life. It is as if the Blues Muse has chanted "I've known rivers ancient as the world and older than the flow of human blood in human veins. My soul has grown deep like the rivers." (Langston Hughes). This sentiment is at the heart of all 14 Blues inspired songs. But like this musical family that has created them, the songs reflect the extended family: Soul, Folk, Jazz, Gospel, Funk, Rock, Americana. Once again, it was written and produced with her dad in their studio. It has also helped to place the band firmly onto the world stage.

Angelique gives reverence to the opportunites she has had to share the stage with Blues legends This past summer, she and her sisters appeared at the Ottawa Jazz Festival with Buddy Guy as part of his "Damn Right Farewell Tour." After the show, and inspired by the talent of Angelique; Guy was eager to tell her stories about giants in the Blues world he had known. Early in his career he had toured with Big Mama Thornton, an artist close to Angelique's

heart. Thornton's

powerful voice, stage presence, song writing and harmonica playing was a a rare thing for female artists then. And her influence can be heard in Angelique's style. Her sound is reminiscent of a bygone era: you will hear Willie Dixon, Koko Taylor, Sister Rosetta Thorpe and Aretha Franklin in that sound but at the same time her music, and the music of her band, is original and relevant to today. To see them live on stage is a sight to behold.

Angelique Francis was "Kissed by the Blues" at a very young age. Today this multitalented, multi-instrumentalist, Juno award winning songwriter and producer WOWS audiences everywhere she performs. As band leader of her own family she orchestrates that into a multi WOW experience.

"I hope to help people have a good time. To dance, to laugh, to connect with each other. The Blues is very powerful."

Finally, I asked Angelique what she would sing, say or play as she approached the Pearly Gates many years from now to get St. Peter to let her in. "I love Gospel music, especially Gospel Blues. I think it would be the perfect place to sing my bluesy Gospel rendition of "Swing Low Sweet Chariot."

I have heard Angelique Francis sing this at her shows and my quess is that not only would the gates fly open but that Mahalia Jackson would be there waiting with open arms and Sister Rosetta Tharpe, guitar swung over her shoulder, will be ready to jam.

Angelique Francis will be playing bass in the Women's Blues Revue Band at the 37th annual Women's Blues Revue at Toronto's iconic Massey Hall on Nov. 17th, 2023.

Did U hear? Blues was in the news lately when megastar Drake used some old footage from Danny Marks' Stormy Monday cable TV show as part of his new release campaign. The footage features Drake's father, Dennis Graham playing "Crosscut Saw" with Danny at Albert's Hall in the early 90s. The video has been viewed millions of times and raised the profile of one of Toronto's already high-profile bluesician and broadcaster. Danny says, "We're looking for video of Dennis Graham's signature piece "For Your Precious Love" from Stormy Monday TV. Drake is delighted to see his dad as a young man, singing the Blues. Heaven and Earth have moved. Dennis and I have also been talking about stoking the fires again to make more music in this century ... Alec Fraser and David Bailey are in touch and looking through the archives. Great things can come of this. Funny thing is that for years I've been hoping to revitalize Stormy Monday - our collective history. There seemed nothing I could do to light the fire, then this happened. Nick Krewen told the story brilliantly. It's a story with many players and parts. Very exciting!"

Saturday Night Blues New Season: Holger Petersen kicked off another season of essential blues programming with lots of Canadian Blues. Always the latest and greatest from Holger with occasional surprises. On his opening show, he played Tony Bennett (and had a great story). Tune in on cbcmusic Saturdays at 6:05 and anytime on the CBClisten app or CBC On Demand.

A rough season for Festivals: Some festivals have rebounded from the great COVID confinement and report record attendance this summer, but for some of them it's been a disastrous year. The Salmon Arm Blues Festival got shut down after one night due to the surrounding fires and smoke. Volunteers were scrambling home to houses burning down! They just posted, " If you purchased tickets to the 2023 festival, you will receive a ticket refund survey by email Tuesday, Sept. 26. In New Brunswick, the Harvest Blues and Jazz Festival had to pack up their tents after one night when Hurricane Lee was headed their way. Artistic Director Brent Staeben posted online "I guess we made the right decision because the wind just knocked over a fridge in the backstage area."

This year was the swan song for the Limestone Blues Festival in Kingston. The

Downtown Kingston Business Improvement Area, the group that put on the festival, announced its end Friday afternoon with a commitment to create a new event in its place. "Kingston has such a rich history of producing top-level musical talent and a reputation as one of the best live music destinations in Canada. Blues has been a key part of that," Jan MacDonald, festival artistic director and director of events at the BIA, said in a news release.

In its announcement, the BIA described the event as a "beloved annual event (that) has been an integral part of the community, showcasing world-class blues talent, fostering a sense of togetherness, and creating lasting memories for countless attendees." According to the announcement, the BIA is working on plans for a new music festival for 2025... to "better reflect Kingston's growing population, and will aim to invite a broader audience to enjoy the experience of a large-scale live music event held in the heart of the city."

There have been many changes in festival directors too and the Vancouver Folk Festival was so far in debt that it was going to cease to exist—until a huge outcry from the festivalgoers forced them to reconsider.

Another festival that's getting a reprieve is the Canal Bank Shuffle which floundered a bit following the passing of their guiding light, Tim Sinnett. But the festival is back – rebranded as The Canal Bank Blues Festival. It's being organized by Brant Parker and Joe Viele, owner of Donnelly's Pub in Thorold.

Robert Johnson legend depicted in art show: 12:06 AM, An Artist's Response to the A.I. 'crisis' is presented by Abbozzo Gallery at 401 Richmond, Toronto. Richard A. Jacobson's exhibition queries the legend of Robert Johnson, who was rumored to have sold his soul to the devil... Jacobson explores the efficacy, morality and usefulness of A.I., bearing witness to its potential as an artist's tool, a spark for inspiration, while cautioning against the presentation of A.I. generated images as one's own creation. In this exhibition, Jacobson employs guitars, Johnson's, and the devil's visage as recurring motifs, introducing new sculptural mediums such as ornamented playable guitars and resin skulls in addition to woodblock prints and the oil paintings he is so well known for.

A.I. is only the most recent technological advancement touted to be the "death" of artists, like Jacobson, and this collection reflects the anxiety that accompanies such grim predictions.

While traditionally a painter, in this series Jacobson experiments with a wide variety of tools and techniques, including 'rival' practices like A.I. Bringing together his fears, curiosity, determination, and creativity, Jacobson constructs a show of artistic resilience. In embracing the tools that mark his fall, could he be making a deal with the devil? Witness the crossroads at "12:06 AM."The Abbozzo Gallery is at 401 Richmond Street West, Suite 128. "Blues in The Key of EH"

The Toronto Blues Society has recently completed a revue process where board members and members of the Musicians Advisory Committee have been getting together to discuss the organization's identity and help shape the path forward. It seems like a good time to look at how other blues societies operate and in this issue, Canada South Blues Society president Mike McCann passed along a quick recap on what's going on with our northern neighbours.

"Blues in The Kev of EH" is the motto of the Canada South Blues Society. They were founded in 2000 and added the Chatham-Kent chapter in 2012. They are a registered nonprofit, recognized by the Blues Foundation with the 2011 Historical Preservation Award and an honorarium from Martin Scorsese for their museum. They survived the Covid shutdown, and continue to present world class blues music, promote local aspiring musicians, and support local charities.

Mike McCann reports, "We also have housed the Canada South Blues Hall of Fame




in Windsor doing close to 100 live inductions with our first being Johnie Johnson and our most recent Canadian induction Monkey Junk and Blackburn.

We were one of the first out of the gate following COVID hosting MonkeyJunk in April 2022 and have not looked back hosting both JUNO and Grammy winners . We are proud members of the Blues Foundation sending artists to the International Blues Challenge in Memphis Tennessee. We are currently having Crystal Shawanda come in November for a Blues In The Schools program. She will do 8 schools in the greater Essex School Board. We are currently completing our 2024 schedule. We are using our shows to help the much-in-need area food banks by asking for donations at our shows."


