

in Toronto. Growing up, she loved music and had sung in several musical productions at Lawrence Heights Junior High never intending to make music her profession. After high school, she was accepted at the University of Toronto to study Psychology with the intention of working with Special Needs children. But while at university she kept returning to theatrical stage shows such as the "Three Penny Opera" at U of T's Hart House. After university she toured across Canada singing and performing in various stage productions. Her star began to shine. Music was increasingly becoming part of her life and would soon define it.

While working at Toronto's Theatre Direct, she met two Toronto musicians, Pat Langner and Jack Nicholsen. It would be a defining moment. They formed a group, calling themselves the Leslie Spit Treeo after a waterfront area in Toronto where they practiced. Laura became lead singer. Like the Shuffle Demons, the Barenaked Ladies and many other Toronto bands, they started as a street busking collective. Before long, this Indie Rock band received recognition, radio play and a Juno in 1991. They released four albums and appeared as themselves in concert in two films directed by Canada's Bruce McDonald. ("Roadkill" and "Dance Me Outside") It helped to make Laura a recognized artist in her own right and part of the vibrant, evolving Toronto music culture.

After twelve years, the Leslie Spit Treeo disbanded but Laura continued her deep dive into the local music scene. She regularly performed at three of Toronto's longest surviving and much-loved music clubs: the Cameron House, Grossman's Tavern and the Rex Hotel. For ten years she hosted the Monday night show at Grossman's Tavern. Then, Jeff Healey, a friend and a regular at Grossman's, rarely missed a Monday night to sit in and play with Laura. It is one of the many reasons that, to this day, Grossman's holds a special place in Laura's heart.

With time, her music, her sound and her style evolved. She formed the Laura Hubert Band with longtime musical partner, jazz pianist Peter Hill. Her band has consisted of some of the best Jazz musicians that Toronto has to offer. She has released four solo albums: "Girlish Days", "Live at the Rex", "Half Bridled" and "One Night at Kensington Market." Today one could easily ask, "is that Blues in her Jazz or Jazz in her Blues?" The answer is simple. Both are true. Her rich, heartfelt vocals embrace Jazz and Pop standards, Blues and Western Swing. Avoiding these labels, Laura says she likes to think of herself as a "singer of old songs". Within that framework Laura's joy and love in music can be heard. "I just like to sing songs, have fun and bring some joy."

Today, Laura continues to be part of the backbone of Toronto's live music scene. The Laura Hubert Band can be found performing at places like the Rex, the Jazz Bistro and the Kensington Market Jazz Festival. Raoul and The Big Time 25 years and counting...

Raoul and The Big Time... 1999 Best New Artist Maple Blues Award winners are still together 25 years after their first gig together in the back room of The Cameron House on Queen St. West in Toronto. They celebrate their 25th Anniversary with a mini festival of two nights of music with special quests including Chris Whiteley and Diana Braithwaite, Danny Marks, Doctor Nick and Jake Chisholm on either Friday November 24th or Saturday November 25th at Hugh's Room.

Raoul Bhaneja, frontman of The Big Time shares five tips on how to help a band survive 25 years:

1. Musical connection: If you don't have a deep musical connection with your bandmates, you won't make it through the thick and thin. When Darren Gallen and I first met at Grossman's and Chicago's Diner in 1997 and 1998 respectively we just clicked. It didn't make a lot of sense on some levels. We'd never talked before. We never hung out. We grew up in different cities and worlds. We had very little in common... but the musical connection was instant and deep. When Tom Bona joined us more regularly in the first six

months or so of the band forming, we found another important piece and connection. Our first upright bass player, Ka-Cheong Liu was a key member of the band until he left Canada for China about a decade later.

2. Heed good advice: Find the mentors that you click with and admire. We had some good advice along the way from many who supported us from the start like Gary Kendall, who booked us at The Silver

Dollar, opening for Bobby Blue Bland early in our history which turned into a life changing experience. Terry Wilkins, who just played a show with us a few weeks ago at 76 years of age, came on board as a producer, co-writer, arranger and mentor around 1999 and has been key in helping us find our sound and defining who we wanted to be as musicians and artists. He guided us through our first record along with the great Alec Fraser. And



Terry went on to collaborate in some way or other on pretty much everything. The advice of Terry and some of the older generation was important to us. Mark Hummel, Junior Watson, Big Dave McLean, Super Chikan, Curtis Salgado, Johnny Sansone, Larry Taylor and many more have shared important stories and lessons... so, heed the good advice.

- 3. Play and Pay Fair: Happy band, happy life. As a band leader, a job I take seriously, it is my responsibility to look after the people who play with me. I try to pay as much as I can, make travel as easy as possible and to feature their talents as musicians. I learned early on that Raoul and The Big Time was enjoyed because of our collective strength not because of a singular performer or performance. The more I could play with the same people at the core of the band, the more opportunity there was for us to grow together. I have brought artists from other parts of Canada and the US here many times and try to do the same from them. I also thought it important to let people work with other artists and try not to get caught up "owning" anyone. That's a crazy idea unless you can pay a significant retainer which hardly anyone can do anymore anyway. We are the original gig economy and people got to work really hard to make a living playing or attempting to play music.
- 4. Fans Are It: No Crowd. No Show. We had a generation of people who grew up with live music and still really value it. They need to be encouraged and accommodated to keep coming and return as long as they can and would like to. That might be new show times, venues or formats. However, we also need to find new audiences and new ways to connect with generations who may not have had access and exposure to live music. Young people will also help define what the music is to become and for them at least what it should be. That can be a bit scary for some, but ultimately it is a good thing. Fans tell us what is working and what is not. Fans. Are. It.
- 5. The Right Reason: Make sure you are in it for the right reasons and the experience is still relevant to you. Over many years it can be easy to lose the plot, the point of the exercise. Sometimes it requires some soul searching and tough decisions. Also, very important to try and communicate with your band mates so you can see if everyone is still engaged and (relatively) on the same page. Without that communication, resentment can build if someone is not in it for the right reason. If they are no longer with it, it's important that they be allowed (or be asked) to move on. People change and life changes people, but if you are in it for the right reason, you can carry on through many trends, changes, transitions... divorces, bankruptcies, jail time...



Remembering Mel Brown: There's a new statue in downtown Kitchener that honours the late musician, Mel Brown. It was unveiled during a special ceremony last month at the intersection of Halls Lane West and Queen Street South. Brown was born in Mississippi in 1939 but how he ended up living the last 30 years of his life in Kitchener is a unique story. The unveiling was attended by Mel's widow, Miss Angel, Kitchener Mayor Berry Vrbanovic, sculptor Abiola Idwu and Glenn Smith, owner of Pop the Gator, who was largely responsible for Mel's move to Kitchener. Smith said without Brown, there is no Kitchener blues scene, "He invented it really. There would be no Kitchener blues fest without him."


