



### "At the Crossroads": Channeling the Spirit of the Blues

"What I would like people to know about "At the Crossroads" is that it is truly a labour of love with the basic goal of offering the best new Blues I can find in any given week." Brant Zwicker.

Since 2009, the Toronto Blues Society has been awarding individuals or groups with the honour and title of "Blues Booster of the Year" at their annual Maple Blues Awards Show. It is a recognition of exceptional dedication to supporting Blues in Canada. This year the Blues Booster of the Year is Brant Zwicker. Brant has been the host, writer and producer of a radio show called "At the Crossroads" since February 2003, coincidentally, the year the Blues were acknowledged by U.S. congress. The timing was perfect for Brant. "I assembled a demo version of the one-hour program and began chasing after radio stations securing my first show a few months later. I continued to pursue radio stations on a grander scale, both nationally and internationally." Today, "At the Crossroads" is widely syndicated and heard 125 times a week on 112 FM transmitters or streaming platforms in Canada, the U.S., the U.K. and Belgium. He has produced nearly 1100 shows and supported and photographed major Blues festivals in Calgary, Kaslo and Salmon Arm.

Brant Zwicker's family were not musicians, but he grew up listening to a variety of music with albums and the radio always being played in the house. In fact, Brant has a long history with the medium of radio. He enrolled at Trent University in the Fall of 1970 eventually completing a BA in Sociology with a minor in Psychology. He began doing some writing and announcing for Trent radio. Upon graduation he was hired by Peterborough's Radio 105 FM where he stayed for four years. Soon, he was drawn to Kamloops BC when he heard a new radio station was to open there. His interest was successful, and he worked there for over eight years. He honed his skills of writing and photography and even did nightclub concert promotions. In 1998 he was hired to start a campus radio station for what is now Thompson Rivers University in Kamloops, B.C. where he resides to this day. His early work in radio encouraged his love of music but his passion for Blues started with a slow fuse. He soon came to realize that all the music he loved the most was Blues based. He started to search out and learn all he could about Blues. And then he decided to share his passion on a unique radio show.

### "Blood makes you related, but Blues makes you family."

"At the Crossroads" originates from Kamloops BC where Brant works with a small but dedicated group of fellow Blues lovers who will soon celebrate 21 years together. "I choose and lay out the music, write the scripts and record the voice. I work with engineer/producer/webmaster Mike Braniff and the imaging voice of Rosemary Trace. They are top notch at what they do; their work and the program was recently nominated for a Broadcast Dialogue's Canadian Radio award, also known as "The Howards", in the categories of multiple-market programming and imaging voice."

"At the Crossroads" endures as a showcase for the diversity and vitality of Blues. It opens with an original theme song by Juno nominated musician Neil Harnett. Brant's playlist caters to a wide range of sub-genres- the Chicago sound, Soul, Hill Country, slightly Jazzy, Rootsy Acoustic, Blues Rock etc. Dedicated listeners appreciate his lifetime knowledge and interest in the Blues, yet he manages to attract new listeners with new music as well as the Classics. "I have come to realize that good is good and I try very hard to find the best new music I can. I pay special attention to how the individual songs flow into each other, and it all seems to work."

Brant retired in 2021 although he says his inspiration and passion for Blues has not wavered to this day. Besides his radio show, he continues as a writer, photographer and fundraiser. He has been a longtime advocate of Canadian Blues Societies and an occasional contributor to the Maple Blues Newsletter.

"Doing what I do in the Blues has simply been a matter of course and much less by intent or design. I am part of the best, friendliest community-musical or otherwise-in the world and doing any kind of work in this community is as natural as breathing. And while we Canadians, of course, love to hear Blues music from outside the country, some of the best musicians on the planet are from here."

Brant Zwicker has been a tireless advocate and ambassador for Blues music in Canada and beyond. His radio show "At the Crossroads" has been a source of information and pleasure for Blues fans and musicians alike for over two decades. It is with pride that the Toronto Blues Society will be presenting the "Blues Booster of the Year" award to Brant Zwicker at the 26th Maple Blues Awards show on Monday, February 12th, 2024, at the Phoenix Concert Theatre.

Remembering Kenny Brown: 47 Records, Gary Kendall's indie label has released a remastered digital only reissue of Kenny Brown & The Pervaders' 1981 single.

The two tracks, both covers, a re I k e Turner's "The Big Question" and Ray Smith's "Willing And Ready". The original sessions took place in



Vancouver B.C at the late Wille MacCalder's recording studio. MacCalder, well known for his work with Powder Blues produced and quested on piano.

Band members, Kenny Brown guitar/vocals, Jim Milne bass and Ted Harrison

drums all passed away in recent years. The surviving Pervader, John Doheny relocated to New Orleans and is active in that city's jazz scene. Jim Milne would be known to Torontonians as a founding member of The Downchild Blues Band.

After spending a decade plus living and performing on the west coast, band leader Kenny Brown moved back to his home town of Toronto in 1984 and formed an eastern version of the Pervaders with a revolving lineup of the city's best bluesicians. The reissue was digitally remastered by studio wiz, L. Stu Young at his El Studio location in Toronto.

Keeping the Blues Alive: Two great friends of the Toronto Blues Society were included in the list of 2024 Keeping The Blues Alive award recipients. Photographer/presenter Laura Carbone and radio personality Mark Stenzler should both be honorary Canadians considering all they've done to promote Canadian blues artists in their respective areas (Laura is in Plattsburg, NY and Mark is in Bern, Switzerland). Laura has captured the essence of the blues for global publications. Her promotion efforts have brought artists to new regions and supported educational initiatives like Blues in the Schools. Carbone's philanthropy includes donating her photos to fundraisers and supporting aspiring young musicians. Her dedication to the blues, often without seeking recognition, showcases her commitment and warrants her recognition with a KBA Award.

Mark Stenzler's career in radio broadcasting has been marked by his love for the blues. His show, Blues Zeppelin, has become a staple for blues enthusiasts and has been instrumental in promoting

blues musicians and festivals. Stenzler's role in the growth of the blues genre and his support for artists' careers make him an exemplary recipient of the KBA Award. Other KBA recipients include John Hall, Jacques Garcia, Larry Chambers, Lee Oskar, The Columbus Blues Alliance, and Blues Association Turkey. The 2024 honorees will be celebrated for their contributions at the Keeping The Blues Alive Awards brunch on Friday, January 19, 2024, at 10:30 AM, located at the Hyatt Centric in Memphis. The awards ceremony is a highlight of the Blues Foundation's 39th Annual International Blues Challenge, which begins on Monday, January 16, 2024. www.blues.org



Mohawk College discontinues Music Program: Just when Hamilton has an influx of musicians looking for cheaper rent and is getting a reputation as a "music city," Mohawk College has decided to suspend their highly acclaimed music program. With the announced suspension of the Applied Music program, no new students will be accepted into the program. Existing students will be fully supported as they continue their studies until the completion of their three-year diploma.

Mohawk College says, "...the program has not been financially viable for several years, with declining enrolment and increasing costs. It is no longer financially possible to offer the depth and quality of courses required to provide students with the high-quality training that has made the Applied Music program so successful."

### André Bisson Latchford

It has been largely under the radar, but Canadian soul/blues/roots singer/songwriter André Bisson has been a prolific recording artist over the past two decades. Latchford is rather a milestone album, as it is the 10th entry in his discography.

It is a consistently strong effort, and one worthy of bringing Bisson increased attention. He has at least been recognised in his hometown of Hamilton, as a five time nominee for the Hamilton Arts Awards, and a victory as Male Vocalist of the Year at the Hamilton Blues awards. He has competed at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, representing Grand River Blues , and won a Song of the Year Award at the 2022 International Song Contest for Blues & Roots Radio for his tune 'Down the Line'.

Worthy of note is the fact that Bisson wrote and produced all the material on Latchford himself, and he contributed electric and acoustic guitar, percussion and harmonica. He recruited a large cast of A-list players here, including keyboardist Jesse O'Brien (Blackie and The Rodeo Kings), veteran saxophonist Pat Carey (part of a four-piece horn section), Loretta Hale (trumpet/cello), Paul Barna (violin, viola), and backing vocalists Quisha Wint and Selena Evangeline.

Latchford was recorded at elite Mississauga studio Metalworks, and the production quality throughout is strong.

Bisson explains that a unifying theme if the album lyrically is "Perspective. Sometimes is not about changing the situation but how we view it. Realizing that when we control our thoughts, we have full control of our lives, our outlook on life, and our reality."


One example of that here is the closing cut, "The Bring Down," a rollicking tune featuring horns and female backing vocals in which Bisson finds the positive in a failed situation, declaring "thank you for bringing me down."

Similar positivity informs another album highlight, "The Reformed Deceiver," released as an early single (Sample lyric: 'Now I'm a believer, a reformed deceiver, I'm through with walking away"). The full-blooded tune features lusty horns, harmonica, and piano, and it showcases Bisson's soulful voice neatly.

Also released as a single earlier, "Shake" has a Motown feel, with horns again to the fore. Horns play a prominent role on many of the songs here, and they are arranged in inventive fashion. The rhythm section of Keagan Early (drums) and Mike Rowell (bassist) is tight throughout, and a funky groove anchors such tunes as "Echo Mountain," "Enough," and "Sticks and Stones."

While most of the album is built upon soul, R&B, and blues elements, a couple of the strongest songs here would fit right into an Americana/roots playlist. "Dusty Albums" features spirited keyboards and a violin solo, while the ballad "Longest Way Around" has something of a country gospel feel, with Bisson's chameleonic vocals to the fore.

Hopefully the stylistic eclecticism of Latchford won't deter those preferring a sound that can be easily pigeonholed, for Bisson is a major talent worthy of your time. (Kerry Doole)



**LJ Mounteney** Mama Danced Puzzle Rabbit Records

LJ Mounteney spent her early years on the prairies. Her mother had a great love of music, which she passed along to her daughter. LJ moved to BC and found herself in Vancouver. After taking the jazz program at Vancouver Community College, she sang in jazz, swing, R&B, roots and pop bands.

A friend suggested that LJ should make a blues album, and introduced her to bluesman and Juno winner Jack Lavin (Powder Blues), who agreed to produce. The pandemic intervened and the album took much longer to complete than originally planned. But it was worth the wait

LJ decided that the focus would be Canadian – as much as possible of the songwriters and musicians would hail from north of the 49<sup>th</sup> parallel. Another priority was to get as many contributions as possible from women.

The title song was inspired of course by her mother, who loved to dance along to her large and varied record collection. 'Mama Danced' was co-written with Lillooet Fox and Jon Roper. Jack Lavin offered up 'I Like It Hot', a Big Easy flavoured number co-written with Jeane Rogers. Both of these zippy tracks are driven by the accordion of Debra Peters.

Another significant contribution is by Maple Blues Award winner Brandon Isaak, who played guitar and harmonica on several songs. He also contributed the gospel-flavoured 'Take My Message', performed here as a tasty duet.

Other Canuckian songs used to good effect are 'Somebody Pour Me Some Coffee' (Alexandrov/Gaye/ Mounteney), 'Wasn't That a Time?' (Jim Foster), 'Life of the Party' (Dennis Meneely), 'Take Some Care of Me' (Linda Kidder) and the clever 'Basement Suite Blues' (Tom Arntzen).

The carefully chosen covers are 'I'm Ready' (Willie Dixon), 'Dirty Rat' (Memphis Minnie), 'I Did My Part' (Allan Toussaint), 'Neighbor, Neighbor' (Huey Meaux) and 'Two Is a Couple' (Ike & Tina Turner).

As well as the spirited production, Jack Lavin contributes harp on some tracks, and plays bass throughout. The talented lineup of BC musicians includes Jan Randall (keys), Jon Roper (guitar), Jerry Cook (saxes), Geeta Daas (trumpet) and Ross Hall (drums). Helping out are Nick Apivor (percussion) and Dee Daniels, Krystle Dos Santos and Lillooet Fox (vocals).

Mama Danced is a very appealing collection of sounds, arrangements, and collaborators. You can bet that we will be hearing more from LJ Mounteney. www. ljmounteney.com (Paul Norton)

### A new category for the MBAs


The Toronto Blues Society has been encouraging the emergence of Indigenous blues talent throughout the years since 1993, when we produced the first all-Indigenous blues show, titled, 'Rez Bluez'. Since then the talent in this genre by Indigenous musicians has grown substantially. During the pandemic the TBS Board proposed the idea of having a Maple Blues Award for an Indigenous Artist or Group. Indigenous influencer Elaine Bomberry called on six Indigenous media personalities who were knowledgeable of the blues genre, and together they compiled an overall list of candidates for the first Maple Blues Award for an Indigenous Artist or Group and voted for the Indigenous Blues Artist/Group. The recipient of this inaugural award is Crystal Shawanda, Anishinabe from Wikwemikong Unceded Territory, Manitoulin Island. Crystal is a multiple JUNO, Maple Blues Award winner and these are just a few of her many accolades. Having crossed over from the country music genre, she made her soulful blues voice known right away from coast-to-coast. Not only does she perform at large festivals and concert halls, she also performs extensively at Indigenous events and speaks to and inspires Indigenous Youth throughout her travels.

This category will honour an Indigenous Artist or Group who have had a successful recording, tour, presence on social media or have had a long-standing career in the blues. There are no sales qualifications for this category. The Advisory Committee for this category are Diane Kohoko, Radio Producer/Host, Event Co-ordinator for Six Nations Radio CKRZ 100.3FM; Amos Key Jr., CEO of CKRZ-FM Six Nations, Director of First Nations Languages over the years with the Woodland Cultural Centre in Brantford; Mell Kirkland, Founder and owner/operator of Vancouver Blues Around Town. She's been presenting blues in Vancouver and is on the Blues Committee for the JUNO Awards; Ted Whitecalf, owner of Sweet Grass Records in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, who has recorded Pow Wow music over 30 years and released over 200 albums; Lance Delisle, who hosts a radio show on CKON 97.3 FM and has been involved in broadcast radio and journalism for the past 30 years in Kahnawake and Montreal. He's also a blues drummer who has performed and toured with Derek Miller, and accompanied Murray Porter at special events in both Kahnawake and Montreal; Dennis Joseph is an Elder from the Squamish Nation, B.C., and he's a traditionally trained speaker in the Coast Salish Longhouse, and is a studio owner, traditional singer and drummer

Though the music program was more focused on jazz, the entire music community is up in arms and encouraging anyone who believes in music education to raise their voices to Mohawk College and the local politicians.

Guy Davis Arts Outreach: American Blues guitarist Guy Davis brings his unique blend of music and storytelling to elementary school students at The River Run Centre in Guelph for 3 performances on February 20-22.

The arts outreach program "Linamar for the Performing Arts", now in its 21st season, is dedicated to building wisdom and understanding of life's broadness and diversity through exposure to professional arts performances of music, dance and theatre. Admission is free so that every child has the opportunity to attend. The program sees an attendance of 32,000 to 34,000 children each year.

Guy Davis has been offering his children's program called "Routes of the Blues" for years at home in NYC, via Lincoln Center Education. 




