

Changes. We will bid adieu to Managing Director **Glenn Smith** as we turn the page as he heads for teaching gigs and leaves TBS having accomplished a lot during transition times. TBS will now look to cover off our grant writing assignments and the office with a new approach and lean more heavily on steady rolling **Manny DeGrandis** with able support from long-time friend and supporter **Lucie Dufault.**

Blues Summit Eleven. Ontario Arts Council CEO and man with a meaningful message Michael Murray will deliver our keynote address at the opening reception of the Chelsea Hotel gathering. The Remarkable Journey of Quisha Wint

Quisha Wint began her musical journey at six years old singing in her church. The response by her congregation and choir director was so loving and positive, she knew, even at that early age, that music was part of her calling. She was born in Toronto into a Jamaican/Canadian home where she absorbed Reggae, Soul, Gospel, Blues and Motown. Inspired, she entered the Jazz program at Canada's highly esteemed school of music, Humber College. After that, she quickly rose in prominence as one of the most in-demand vocalists and session musicians in the business, working with artists like Johnny Reid, Jacksoul, Snow, Maestro Fresh Wes and Paul Shaffer, just to name a few. These collaborations soon had her touring around the world. However, the first time that all of Canada collectively saw Quisha was when she sang on the first Season of Canadian Idol in 2003. Unable to make the auditions in Toronto as she was appearing as Tina Turner in the Legends Tina Turner Show, she eventually drove herself to Ottawa for the audition, easily making her way to the top tier of performers.

In 2012 Ouisha released her first album, aptly titled The Journey. She co-founded and became president of QW Productions, a professional source of support designed to inspire artists to live their dreams. "Our mission is to provide a platform for musicians to showcase their awesome gifts." QW also honors legendary musicians and songs of the past by encouraging young and upcoming artists to keep this music vital and recognized. As a music director and producer, Ouisha has become a beacon for love and hope, and is often requested as a motivational speaker at both artistic and corporate events. In 2021, she released an EP entitled My Life to rave reviews. Its single, "Black Shoes" is a dramatic, potent song in response to the infamous murder of George Floyd and the Black Lives Matter movement. The song

evolved organically and communally with her band. "The band had gotten together after a really long break and we just wanted to play. The groove was there from the start but there was no real intention to write such a powerful song. We were just working the song out when we realized we were all literally wearing black shoes. It became a grassroots song, but as it developed it got very powerful all on its own. We all share song writing credit on it." The song frames a difficult truth through words and music without the intention of polarization. It soon became #1 on the Canadian Indie Music Artists Charts.

Quisha's beautiful vocals have defined her as a great singer but she is equally no stranger to success in business or the arts. Entrepreneur, director, producer, songwriter, arranger, entertainer and choir director: her musical journey now includes acting. She recently appeared as a choir performer in a Netflix featured mini-series called Self Made: the Story of Madame C.J. Walker. She also appeared in the film The Clark Sisters: First Ladies of Gospel. But Quisha feels that her greatest source of love and inspiration is as a mom. "Having a child has changed my perspective on life. I view the world differently and can only hope that I am raising someone who will make a difference in this world." That seems an achievable task as there is no question that Quisha has always encouraged others to follow their dreams. She has mentored and supported young artists while inspiring them to open their hearts to the music of the past. Her singing performances have and still continue to ignite passion and love.

Once again this year, Quisha will be hosting the Toronto Blues Society's Maple Blues Awards gala to be held on February 12th at the Phoenix Concert Theatre. Quisha will also be featured in a night of music to chase the January blues away with 9 time Juno nominated jazz guitarist Michael Occhipinti and quests at the newly located Hugh's Room on January 13th. 
